

NCAA MEN'S TEAM SCORES

The scoring system has undergone multiple changes through the years, in terms of both places scored and points given for each:

1921 & '22—5 places (5-3-2-1-½)

1923—6 places (5-4-3-2-1-½)

1924—meet not held so as to avoid Olympic-year conflict with Trials.

1925—no official team scoring, but the NCAA retroactively awarded an “unofficial” title based on 6 places (5-4-3-2-1-½)

1926—no official team scoring, but the NCAA retroactively awarded an “unofficial” title based on 6 places (6-4-3-2-1-½)

1927—no official team scoring, but the NCAA retroactively awarded an “unofficial” title based on 6 places (10-8-6-4-2-1)

1928 through '81—6 places (10-8-6-4-2-1)

1982—12 places (15-12-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1); places 9–12 in lane races came from “consolation finals” which were for the 4 lowest spots

1983 & '84—same 12-place scoring as in '82, but there were no consolation finals; lower places in lane races based on time from the semis

1985 through today—8 places (10-8-6-5-4-3-2-1)
