

— Wanjiru Sets Chicago Course Record —

Chicago, October 11—The Sammy Wan-
jiru traveling marathon show blew into Chi-
cago for his first race on Ameri-
can soil.

After thrilling the crowd
with his trademark pedal-
to-the-metal start, the Kenyan
phenom idled away time like a
stuck-in-a-Loop traffic jam be-
fore accelerating away from the
field and sauntering across the
finish line in 2:05:41, just a sec-
ond below Khalid Khannouchi's
course best (and former World
Record) and the fastest 26-mil-
er ever run in the U.S.

"It was good history," the
22-year-old Olympic cham-
pion exclaimed. "It was my first
time in Chicago, and first time
in the U.S. Then I made the
course record and the U.S. soil
record and I cannot forget it in
my life."

Indeed it was a memorable
performance given the cold
(34–39 degree) temperatures
and finishing headwind that
seemed to preclude a record
run. Despite the cold start, it
didn't take long for Wanjiru
and a band of Kenyans to warm
up as they led off the parade
with an opening 14:34 for the
first 5K.

With Wanjiru waving the
pacemakers forward through
10K (29:11) and 15K (44:00),
he found his way into Haile
country—on sub-2:04 pace.
Like his blitzkrieg getaway in
his last two races ('08 Olympics
and '09 London), Wanjiru thrives on the hare
start.

"The pace was very good and I was feel-
ing very comfortable," he said. "That pace for
me is not very high and I was thinking about
2:03- something."

Inevitably the pace slowed as battling the
cold consumed precious energy. "The prob-

lem is how to maintain the high pace in the
cold," Wanjiru recalled as he added, "After
20K the pace was going low."

Ivuti: "After halfway, the pacemaker was real
tired. I told Mr. Ivuti to try to push to maybe
25K. After that, it is OK, don't worry about
it." Clocking 14:50 from
20-25K, the pace lagged
to 15:05 and 15:12 seg-
ments as the three remain-
ing contenders pressed on
alone through the streets
of southwest Chicago.

At 30K, Wanjiru ad-
mitted, "When I saw the
time was 1:28:40-some-
thing, I saw that the record
was gone. So I had to focus
on how to win." His prin-
cipal concern was Kipruto,
who ran 2:05:47 to win
Paris last April in only his
second marathon effort.

Whatever may be said
of his brazen pacing, Wan-
jiru is foremost a competi-
tor, having won four of his
five career marathons.
"Sometimes I go to the
front and test people to see
if they are strong," the Ki-
kuyu Kenyan said.

"Kipruto was very
strong and I was think-
ing about him. The last
6K, I did like last year in
the Olympics: I started
to sprint and got further
[away] from him. That is
my tactic."

While the other run-
ners couldn't alter their
slowing pace, Wanjiru
was again full of run as
he clocked 14:58 into the
cold headwind that blew

down Michigan Avenue. "That straight was

Cruising past halfway in 62:01, the 9-
man pack was soon trimmed to four Kenyans,
with fellow 22-year-old Vincent Kipruto, 23-
year-old debuting Charles Munyeki and '07
Windy City champ Patrick Ivuti (relegated to
pacing after recurrent knee injuries).

Recognizing the slowing tempo, Wanjiru
tried to coax a few more kilometers out of

very hard and the wind was very strong," he observed of the stretch run that propelled him to victory.

Heading towards the finish line, Wanjiru appeared to have the win and course record in hand, before he began to salute the crowd as the clock continued to tick. "I was feeling happy, feeling good that the people were waiting for me. So I was saying hi, hi, hi," he said.

"And I did the sign like Usain Bolt. You know, that guy is very interesting. I like him. He is good for the sport, he has fun." Adding a final Bolt-esque gesticulation, Wanjiru danced across the finish mat to claim the \$100K record bonus by a mere second.

"Unbelievable," Wanjiru said with true amazement. "You know, for me I didn't know about the course record time. I didn't think about that one." Perhaps Wanjiru's lack of concern about the record bonus reflected the \$500,000 World Marathon Majors jackpot that he secured with his win.

As the crowd still buzzed with the unexpected drama, Moroccan Abderrahim Goumri sprinted home 2nd in 2:06:04, four seconds ahead of Kipruto. Having been burned by Wanjiru's surging pace in London last April, Goumri was determined to run his own race. "I decided to run alone," Goumri said of his race plan.

In sharp contrast to the men's fast start, the women's race—sans pacers—took a long time to warm up. A formidable lead group that included reigning World Marathon Majors champ Irina Mikitenko, as well as past Chicago champions Deena Kastor, Lidiya Grigoryeva and Berhane Adere, eased past halfway in 1:15:05.

Only after 30K did the pace pick up and Kastor and Adere fell out of contention. At 40K, Mikitenko and Grigoryeva ran together with Liliya Shobukhova and Teyba Erkesso when the green flag was waved and the racing began. Shobukhova and Mikitenko lifted the pace sharply and the two former tracksters gained instant separation.

Shobukhova's track gear was sharpest as shown by the 14:23.75 5000 that she ran in '08, plus the power she displayed in sprinting home to win in 2:25:56. The 31-year-old finished 35 seconds ahead of Mikitenko's 2:26:31.

More impressive than her finishing time, Shobukhova scorched the final 2195 meters in a staggering 6:36, 4:51 mile pace—and faster than either Wanjiru or Goumri.

For AR holder Kastor, 6th in 2:28:50, there was some satisfaction in completing her first marathon since breaking her foot in Beijing. "Our feet are our foundation," Kastor said, "and I did have to start from scratch earlier this year. But when you have a great support system, moving up is pretty easy.

"I feel really good about where I am right now. My day kind of fell a little short, but I'm still pretty ecstatic at the way my body has

held up and how strong I have gotten over the past few months."
