

— USATF Women: ARs For Lowe, Patterson —

Des Moines Iowa; June 24–27—Call it the high-flyers' circus: Chaunté Lowe's show on Saturday and Jenn Suhr's on Sunday.

How can America's leaping lady be a Lowe-jumper?

Well, "Chaunté The Entertainer" has mastered the routine.

Moments after she high-leaped 6-8¾ (2.05)—best in the world this year outdoors and best-ever by an American anywhere—at the USATF Championships, she did a backflip-for-joy in the Drake Stadium pit.

The crowd loved it. But the show was not over; she had a huge surprise up her Nike sleeve.

After several rounds of interviews, the mom of a 3-year-old daughter toweled down and headed over to the long jump area.

And she astounded fans once again by spanning 22-7¾ for 2nd in an event she'd virtually abandoned for five years. A 21-8¾ (6.61) leap at a meet in Jamaica this spring had been her first major-meet effort since '05.

Amazingly, only reigning world champion Brittney Reese, with a wind-aided 23-2¾ (7.08), got the better of her.

Lowe had exulted after the high jump triumph, "I love jumping here. Man, this was like a dream come true. The surface is awesome, the crowd is awesome, and the weather was awesome.

"To break the American Record at home, that's what anybody can dream of. "It just meant so much and I am truly blessed."

Lowe thus improved on the AR she'd set on May 30, and moved into a tie for No. 9

on the all-time world list.

Suhr had failed to clear a relatively modest 15-1 (4.60) in her only major spring outing, two weeks earlier at the adidas Grand Prix.

Injury-wracked, she'd been a shadow of

screens most of last winter.

But she roared back to the top of the heap with a 16-½ (4.89), clearance, best in the world this year, to grab the Sunday spotlight, and give the meet a sensational, star-studded ending.

It was her fifth consecutive American crown and kept alive her chances of eventually equaling or surpassing Stacy Dragila's record run of 7 (1999–05).

"I don't want to say it was a surprise, but it's good to be back," she smiled.

Beating top foes Becky Holliday (15-1), Mary Saxer (14-9/4.50 PR), Lacy Janson, Melinda Owen and Worlds silver medalist Chelsea Johnson (all 14-5¼/4.40) was one thing, but beating Drake's tricky winds was quite another.

"You know, it was tricky and I think I would have preferred a tailwind," she said. "And it's waiting [out] your [regularly gusting] wind, too, and knowing when to go and when not to go.

"I've been around, so I can kind of figure that out. But it is tricky and the warm-up was definitely hard. It was hard for a lot of girls. You know, they predicted that it was going to change, but it didn't change until late."

The former Jennifer Stuczynski, the Beijing silver medalist made this her first title as a married woman.

"You know, it's funny. I've won a lot of U.S. national championships, but this one's probably the most

meaningful. This one was a hard fought one mentally.

"You know, Rick [coach Rick Suhr] and I

her old self for many months, staying out of the World Championships in Berlin, and was nowhere to be seen on her sport's radar

got married and I had injuries going on and everything, and it's one we both needed.

"It's having one other person believing in you. It's having that one person telling you that you can do it."

There were daily doses of big-time achievement throughout the Nationals.

Jav record-smasher Kara Patterson delivered Friday's big bombshell, not only winning her third straight U.S. title but crushing the American Record (210-7/64.19 by Kim Kreiner in '07.)

With a mighty heave of 218-8 (66.67) on her sixth and final attempt, Patterson helped restore American hopes in an event where U.S. prestige has lagged for more than a decade.

She won by the huge margin of 34 feet over Rachel Yurkovich.

"I had my best series ever," said the exuberant Patterson. "Four throws over 200 feet is pretty exciting.

"This whole season has been about consistency, and I'm finally getting there."

The women's discus gold went to Becky Breisch, on a whirl of 207-10 (63.34), as Olympic champion Stephanie Brown Trafton settled for 3rd at 196-9 (59.98).

Nine times a U.S. steeple finalist, Lisa Aguilera took it for the second time with a 9:53.59.

Miami U collegian T'erra Brown captured the 400 hurdles in 54.85, rallying past UCLA's Nicole Leach (55.83) over the final three barriers.

Ex-Penn Stater Consuella "Connie" Moore (22:40) edged Shalonda Williams (22:47) for the 200 title; it was Alysia Johnson ahead of the 800 field (1:59.87).

Other Saturday features: Debbie Dunn's 400-meter victory in 49.64 was a women's world leader, and so was Hyleas Fountain's heptathlon score of 6,735 points.

Further front-runners Saturday: crowd favorite hurdler/Nationals poster-girl Lori "Lolo" Jones, a hometown Des Moines product (12.69); 1,500-meter runner Anna Pierce (4:13.65) over front-running Erin Donohue; shot putter Jillian Camarena (62-9 ¼) and hammer heaver Amber Campbell (a solid 234-8.)

"There was so much pressure on me," said Jones. "I was lucky to survive it. They put a lot on me coming in here. I'm glad I can relax, at last."

Fountain, the 2008 Olympic hept silver medalist, finished a stunning 729 ahead of silver medalist Sharon Day.

World champion Sanya Richards-Ross sat out the 400 final with a quadriceps injury.

A Friday headliner was Allyson Felix, dipping down to the 100 but convincing as ever. Running 11.27 in the face of a 2.5 gust, she outclassed LaShaunte'a Moore (11.34) and 2005 World LJ champ Tianna Madison (11.43.)

Thursday night's big news: Amy Begley's 25th-lap sprint past fan favorite/NCAA champ Lisa Koll of Iowa State to win the 10,000 in 32:06.45.

Sunday's 20K racewalk, staged on a 1-K University Avenue road loop, a block from Drake Stadium, had a surprise winner, too.

Maria Michta, a doctoral student in biomedical sciences from New York, took the lead when vet Teresa Vaill bailed out with problems, then walked away from another vet, Joanne Dow, to win it in 1:39:47.
