

### — Lausanne DL: Banged-Up Bolt Returns —

Lausanne, Switzerland; July 8—It's a measure of the attention Usain Bolt that currently commands within the sport that he can switch events at two days notice at a Samsung Diamond League meeting and have a 100-meter race specially created in his honour.

Bolt arrived in the Swiss city with a sore Achilles that was still inflamed, having not run since his 300 outing in Ostrava at the end of May and carrying doctor's orders not to take a curve at speed.

So the Athletissima organizers quickly got special dispensation from the DL powers to bend the rules and to add an additional race for the crowd pleaser.

Plenty of people were miffed that the anticipated 200 matchup against the in-form Walter Dix wouldn't occur.

Especially as the DL has been sold hard since its launch as providing regular head-to-head contests between the top athletes, but Bolt himself didn't disappoint when he was on the straightaway.

The Jamaican phenom sped to 9.82, equalling the world lead by his compatriot Asafa Powell, who he is scheduled to face in Paris next Friday over the same distance.

In truth, Bolt only needed to put in a bit of effort in the middle of the race to win his first race in 42 days.

"It hurt slightly," he said. "My start wasn't

good but the second half was OK. I would not say it was painful but that it takes time to heal. However, I was feeling extremely nice and good."

20.08, with resurging Xavier Carter next in 20.15, his fastest time since September of '07.

Jeremy Wariner managed to reduce his own word-leading 400 mark to a relatively modest 44.57, the hip flexor problem that caused him to pull up at the USATF Championships apparently a thing of the past.

Running in lane 6, he couldn't see Belgium's Jonathan Borlée four lanes inside him and flying over the first furlong, the '09 NCAA champion almost drawing level with Wariner at the halfway point.

However, while Borlée faded coming off the final bend, the Texan held his poise and powered home over the final 100.

"I'm happy with the time; things are moving ahead nicely. This time was planned because I wanted to take the leadership again in this discipline," said Wariner, following two years when the two-time world champion relinquished pole position to the now suspended LaShawn Merritt.

LaJerald Betters, who like Wariner is a Baylor alum, came through for 2<sup>nd</sup> in improving his PR to 44.70.

In addition to Bolt and Wariner, there were six other world leads, four of them coming in a spate of superb

distance races.

Kenya's Nicolas Kemboi won the 1500 in 3:31.52 while his compatriot Brimin Kipruto took the steeple in 8:01.62, the Olympic champion showing a clean pair of heels off the final bend to Uganda's Benjamin Kiplagat, who sliced more than 9 seconds off his

With Bolt out of the 200, Dix had few problems winning in a slick 19.86, running a strong middle part of the race despite a mediocre start.

Running on a track that has been kind to half-lappers in the past, Churandy Martina took 2<sup>nd</sup> in a Netherlands Antilles' Record

own national record at 8:03.81.

Ethiopia's Gelete Burka became the first woman to go under 4:00 for the year with her 1500 of 3:59.28, just holding off Morocco's Ibtissam Lakhoud (NR 3:59.35).

Finishing 5<sup>th</sup> in a loaded race, Morgan Uceny had an excellent run and was rewarded with a PR of 4:02.40 that made her the No. 9 American ever.

Although far from Meseret Defar's indoor 8:24.26, Kenya's Vivian Cheruiyot won the women's 3000 in an outdoor-leading 8:34.58.

The jumps also provided two world-pacing marks.

Cuba's Yargelis Savigne bounded out to 49-2 ¼ (14.99) in the triple jump, and in the deepest men's high jump competition of the year, the Russian pair of Ivan Ukhov and 2009 WC gold medallist Yaroslav Rybakov

both went over 7-7¼ (2.33),

Ukhov (who did 7-9¾/2.38 indoors) got the verdict with a first-time clearance at the deciding height and finally made amends to meet management for his infamous vodka-fueled appearance two years ago which became a YouTube viral hit.

Continuing with the jumps, Brittany Reese won the women's LJ with 22-9¼ (6.94), the best by a US athlete this year.

## — Gateshead DL: Gay Outprints Powell —

Gateshead, England; July 10—When Tyson Gay ventured to northeast England for his first 100 of the season at the Aviva Grand Prix, he knew who his prime foe would be: Asafa Powell, world leader with his 9.82 exactly a month earlier in Rome.

“I believe that right now Asafa is still the guy to beat, regardless of what anyone else in the world has run,” said Gay after arriving for Diamond League stop No. 8, kicking off the second half of the new circuit’s inaugural season.

Said Powell, “I really want all the guys to be in form because I’m not happy when any of the guys are hurt.”

Gay had shown a week earlier that he is rounding into racing shape after his back/hamstring problems with his 19.76 to finish just 0.04 behind Walter Dix’s winner in the Pre 200.

Swirling winds bedeviled performances here, as the century heats showed. Gay led from the gun in his prelim and ran powerfully for 90 meters into the 1.6mps breeze before slowing. Yet he clocked a 9.96.

American Trell Kimmons led Powell off the line in the second heat, run into a marginally stronger 2.0mps headwind. But Powell edged ahead in the later stages before easing off at 95 meters while clocking 10.11.

For the final, the two prime protagonists drew adjoining lanes, Powell in 3 and Gay in 4.

“I enjoyed racing Asafa,” said Gay, who grimaced and reached back to massage his right hamstring after finishing. “I wasn’t sure I had won. I had hoped to run a little faster, but I’m satisfied with the race. I’m still a little rusty.”

“We race [close] like that all the time. It will always be close with just a few meters to go. I always enjoy racing him.”

Powell admitted, with a wry smile, “I forgot I was racing Tyson Gay and I eased up a bit too much. But Tyson is a great competitor and I don’t mind losing to him.”

In the women’s 100, Trinidad’s Kelly-Ann Baptiste rode a 1.2 wind to a 10.93 meet record in her qualifier. Conversely, ’09 top-ranker Carmelita Jeter faced a negative 1.5 breeze as she took her heat at 11.08.

Like with the men’s race, the star pair lined up in adjacent lanes, Jeter in 4 and Baptiste in 5. Jamaica’s Sherone Simpson knelt next to Baptiste in 6 and led the field off the line at the crack of the starting gun.

And like Gay, Jeter maintained the strongest form deepest into the race, moving ahead to stay in the final 10 meters as she won at 10.95. The wind registered just 0.3 as Baptiste (11.00) nosed out Simpson (11.02) for 2<sup>nd</sup>.

“I was just trying to get to the finish line first,” said Jeter. “I just want to win and then the times should come from that. I might be under-raced a little, since there is no major team to make this year. But I’m pleased with the race today.”

Another pleased American winner was 100 hurdler Lolo Jones, who dominated from the start en route to a 12.79 win, into a 1.7 wind. She easily outran the 12.98 by Danielle Carruthers.

“I’ve been undefeated in Diamond League races so far and that has really helped my confidence,” said Jones. “With no Worlds or Olympics this year, the Diamond League is the main thing we have. So we can put all our focus on that.”

In the women’s 800, U.S. champ Alysia Johnson took over at the bell from Britain’s ’09 Worlds bronze medalist Jenny Meadows. But Christin Wurth-Thomas spurred ahead with 250 to go and led until Johnson regained the lead just into the final straight.

A 59.8 final circuit closed Johnson’s 1:59.84 win as Morocco’s Halima Hachlaf (2:00.49) closed fast on the outside to take 2<sup>nd</sup> from Ukraine’s Yuliya Krevsun (2:00.67). Wurth-Thomas (2:00.75) held off Meadows (2:00.97) for 4<sup>th</sup>.

In the meet-concluding 5000, Galen Rupp ran at the back of a 9-man pack as the last-lap bell kick started the final sprints. The Oregonian soon dropped back as Kenya’s Vincent Chepkok clocked a 55.7 last lap to

time 13:00.20 and hold off teammate Eliud Kipchoge (13:00.24) and Ethiopia's Imane Merga (13:00.48) in the homestraight.

Rupp came home 9<sup>th</sup> in 13:10.05 to cut more than 4 seconds off his career best set indoors and shave more than 20 from his fastest ever outdoors as he moved to No. 8 on the all-time U.S. list (see chart).

## — Rudisha Scares WR In Heusden 800 —

Heusden-Zolder, Belgium; July 10—Pundits have talked about David Rudisha's having all the physical talents to supersede Wilson Kipketer as the 800 World Record holder ever since he won the world Junior title in

However, knowing that he was in great shape and wanting a crack at becoming just the fourth man to go under the 1:42-barrier, but not wishing to bring any untoward attention to himself, Rudisha took to short flight to Belgium for an ostensibly low-key outing at the famous Heusden meeting, a distance running gala which has a fast track for 800 times.

He brought his own pacemakers with him and they led him through to 550m.

Hare Sammy Tangui went through the 400 in 49.14 with Rudisha two strides behind and going through the bell at 49.5.

His friend and training partner Boaz Lalang kept the pace going for another 150 but, despite working to the max, he couldn't keep going to the designated 600 mark and Rudisha came through on the inside with 250 to go.

He clocked 1:14.4 at 600 and then hardly tied up, although the effort was etched all over his face as he knew he was on for a fast time, to end the race in an African Record and with the No. 3 performance ever.

Only Kipketer, at 1:41.11 and 1:41.24, has run faster in the history of running over two laps of the track.

"I felt great after running in Lausanne," Rudisha told *T&FN*. "Lausanne was a tough

meeting with tough guys like Mbulaeni Mulaudzi and there I was just running to finish first. But I wanted to run without pressure so I chose this meet to run a fast race.

"On the first lap, I was feeling alright and I was moving very well, it was a fast first 400 but I was feeling very strong. Even down the back straight the second time I was still feeling good, but I have to say that my last 100 meters was difficult, perhaps my last 150 meters still needs some work

"I was hurting down the last 100 meters but this is no surprise. When you are trying to run a fast race, trying to do something that

you have never done before, then this will be a little bit tougher than usual.

"As I said, if I want to improve further then I need to improve in the last 150, that what I have to do if I want to get better.

Rudisha knows now that he has raised expectations. He is prepared to live with that but has not decided where and when to attack Kipketer's mark.

He will return to Nairobi and defend his African title later this month but will be running there just for the win. Brussels and/or Rieti at the end of the season are the most likely venues for a full tilt record attempt.

"The World Record is now my next target," he confirmed. "First I wanted to run 1:41-something but I've now made that step and I'm going to start thinking about the world Record.

"It's a great feeling, a joy to run well and become the second-fastest man ever, I'm happy that I'm getting the rewards for all my hard work and that everything has been going well.

"I still have long way to go, the world record is not something that will come easily but I'm very happy and but I feel proud to now be faster than great champions like Coe and Cruz," added Rudisha, recognizing his place in history, after having moved ahead of greats like Seb Coe and Joaquim Cruz on the all-time list.
