

### — Stockholm DL: Gay Stuns Bolt —

Stockholm, Sweden; August 6—Tyson Gay has proved it: Superman can be beaten. At the 43rd DN Galan, stop No. 11 in the inaugural Samsung Diamond League season, the American Record holder outsprinted Usain Bolt with a 9.84 win in the 100.

In the biggest matchup yet of the type the DL was designed to serve up, Gay reacted marginally more quickly to the gun than his Jamaican rival (0.164–0.176), ran him even through the first half of the race and then pulled away to a convincing 9.84–9.97 victory.

Olympic silver medalist Richard Thompson took 3<sup>rd</sup> at 10.10.

Gay, just three days shy of his 28th birthday, had been on a mission for this moment since the summer of '08.

At the Reebok Grand Prix on May 31 of that year, Bolt, in just the fifth 100 of his pro career, trounced then-reigning double world sprint champion Gay with a 9.72 World Record, the first jolt of what would become Bolt's record-smashing legacy of the following Olympic and World-Championships seasons.

Bolt incurred one loss in '08—in Stockholm that July, in fact, following Asafa Powell across the line in a 9.88–9.89 duel. But in 14 century finals since Beijing's he had not lost, and he had defeated Gay 3 times.

Even Gay's 9.71 then-

AR in Berlin last summer left him trailing in the wake of Bolt's boggling 9.58 WR.

But not this time. "My body worked well today," Gay said. "I was excited and motivated. My start was OK and I must admit I was

surprised not to see Usain in front after half of the race. But I knew he is not 100% ready. Still it feels good to be the winner but I think I can run lot faster."

Bolt, whose 200 win streak still lives after

13 finals, said, "This is my easy season... If you don't beat me this season, it's not going to happen next season because next year is a championship year."

Still Bolt himself has said he never lines up planning to lose and Gay's triumph was a nice shot in the arm for the rivalry.

"I am happy with the victory," Gay said, "but still looking forward to when Usain and Asafa will be in 9.6 shape to race with them."

Bolt partisans—and a guy with (give or take a couple) 2,167,291 Facebook fans inevitably has a few—were quick to cite his recent Achilles injury, sidestepping the fact that Gay has struggled through aches and pains of his own this summer.

"I got beat today by an athlete who was in better form and shape than I was," Bolt wrote to his followers. "It was one of those days... I got a great start, but there was no power and I came in 2<sup>nd</sup>. There is no excuse!"

DN Galan, favored with low-70s temperatures that dropped into the mid-60s as the long Swedish dusk descended, offered plenty more.

The meet actually started on a day note before the main date with the "Big Shot" competi-

tions in a downtown square, with Christian Cantwell remaining unbeaten and running his winning streak to 20 meets over two years as he unleashed a 72-5¼ (22.09) toss that clinched the DL series for him.

Age-group fans were thrilled to see recent World Junior champ Jacko Gill of New Zealand, just 15, win the under-18 shot (5 kilo) at 73-11 (22.53), the No. 2 Youth performance ever.

Chris Solinsky (see p. 366) ended up 5<sup>th</sup> in the 5K—Mark Kiptoo won in a PR 12:53.46—but claimed a PR 12:55.53 that rates as the No. 2 performance in U.S. history.

On the women's side, Blanka Vlašić matched Cantwell as a 5-time winner on the DL circuit, running her season record over Chaunté Lowe in the high jump to 9-2 as she cleared 6-7½ (2.02).

## Solinsky Talks About His PR

Quotes garnered by *T&FN* correspondent Jonas Hedman after Chris Solinsky's big PR in Stockholm:

"I knew if I was competing in a race like this today, they were going to run like they did. I mean they were asking for a 12:50 pace so I knew if I played my cards right and stayed close towards the end I had a chance at the American Record..."

"Yeah, a 1-second PR; I thought I was 12:56. Any time you get under 13:00 it's a good race, and you know, the mission for me..."

"Our workouts have been going really well, and if the opportunity presents itself to run the American Record or even in the 12:50 range, that's what we're shooting for. It's not so much about time, but more about just competing and being competent running with the best guys in the world because we feel like I'm at that level where I'm one of the best guys in the world..."

"My fitness is about the same [as at Pre]. The difference between now and Eugene is I'm rested. In Eugene I kind of was preparing for this, for August—for Stockholm here and for Zurich in two weeks. So, yeah, I was fit [at Pre] but my legs definitely were not under me..."

"Once we got finished with Oslo [where PRed at 12:56.66], we said, 'OK, let's get back to work.' Let's see if we can knock even more time off."

"I'm excited for the two races ahead but disappointed with tonight, knowing that I was there; I've just got to finish it and I didn't quite finish it. So it's coming, but this year and next year and even the start of 2012 are all about gaining experience so we can have a chance at an Olympic medal."
