

— Zürich DL: Half The Diamonds Awarded —

For sheer drama in the outcomes of the various Diamond races, the Zürich Weltklasse final fell a bit short, as all 16 pre-meet leaders survived to win their respective event's top prize. (The remaining 16 will be awarded at the Van Damme meeting in Brussels on Friday.)

Within those encounters, however, came some of the riveting matchups that the Zürich crowd has come to expect in this fixture's long history.

Five of the 16 Diamonds—the men's 200, 400, 110H; women's 100 & 1500) had been decided mathematically during the summer's first 14 competitions, with the frontrunners merely having to show up.

That didn't happen, as 200 clincher Walter Dix, who had pulled up halfway through the London 100, couldn't start and was thus eliminated from consideration.

Running in lane 7, Wallace Spearmon lowered the Weltklasse standard with a brilliant 19.79, pulling Yohan Blake, on his immediate inside, to a 19.86.

Jeremy Wariner chose the Letzigrund Stadium for making his boldest statement of the season with a world-leading 44.13 in the 400, his fastest performance since the Weltklasse meeting two years ago.

Jermaine Gonzales on Wariner's outside pushed the Texan hard during the middle stages of the race and appeared to have a small lead going into the final curve.

But that just gave Wariner a useful pacemaker as they

headed into the final straight. The normally passive Wariner gave a rare emotional glimpse of his inner feelings with a crisp hand clap after seeing the infield clock right after the finish as Gonzales followed in 44.51.

In the hurdles, David Oliver continued his unbeaten (12 in a row) season with a spectacular 12.93 after a lunge at the finish brought him under the eyebeam.

Ryan Wilson, on Oliver's immediate right, ran a strong first half, but Dwight Thomas came up at the end to claim 2nd from the American, 13.25–13.26.

Veronica Campbell-Brown's good start in the women's 100 was almost (but not quite) negated in the final meters by Carmelita Jeter's late burst.

Both were timed in 10.89, with the Jamaican getting the nod from the photo judge. It was not enough to overcome Jeter's secure event advantage in the Diamond race, however.

Kenyan Nancy Lagat won the women's 1500 for the third DL in a row (and fifth overall) with her 4:01.01.

Kaliese Spencer became a clincher when Lashinda Demus didn't enter the 400H. In the American's absence, Spencer scored not only a diamond but also a PR 53.33.

The last running event on the program, the men's 5000, had the potential of scrambling the Diamond positions, but Imane Mergé was able to retain his lead with a runner-up 12:56.34 behind the winning 12:55.03 of Tariku Bekele.

Although this was surely not in his mind at the time, Chris Solinsky was in position to move Bekele into the overall Diamond win as he was attempting to overhaul



Merga at the end.

The Wisconsin native's 3rd-place 12:56.45 came at the end of a smartly run race in which he stayed with the lead pack the entire way and posted his third sub-13 time (and No. 10 by an American).

Were it not for a sagging pace during the third and fourth kilos, Solinsky would have been in good position to attack Bernard Lagat's two-month-old AR. He later Tweeted, "It would have been nice had the pace stayed on track for record, but my concern is to compete, time is irrelevant it will come w/ competing!"

Galen Rupp, running a strong final kilo, made up much of the earlier distance he had left behind Solinsky and ended with a notable PR 13:07.35 in 12th, a good recovery after his fall in Stockholm two weeks ago.

A milestone of sorts occurred between the two American finishers as Britain's Mo

Farah clocked 12:57.94 in fifth to become his country's first sub-13 runner and took down Dave Moorcroft's '82 NR (a WR at the time) of 13:00.41.

Besides Jeter and Merga, three others failed to win in Zürich but still preserved their overall event lead. Christina Obergföll controlled the women's javelin for the day with a 67.31 win over Barbora Špotáková (65.34), but the Czech easily ruled the points race.

Paul Koech knew that his principal steeple challenger, Brimin Kipruto, was far back at the steeple finish, so he was not overly concerned with his 2nd-place 8:05.48 behind Ezekiel Kemboi (8:01.74) as Kipruto finished 7th.

An even closer point battle was waged in the men's discus, which Piotr Małachowski took home his prize with a runner-up 68.48 behind Robert Harting's 68.64, as other Diamond aspirants Zoltán Kővágó and Gerd Kanter slipped to 4th and 5th.

Three other Diamonds were won by Americans.

With a strong finish in the 400, Allyson Felix (50.37) overtook Debbie Dunn (50.57) in the final meters.

Brittney Reese set an unreachable target for the others with her leadoff 22-7¼ (6.89) in the long jump, and Dwight Phillips used precisely the same script as his 26-11 (8.20) captured the men's event.

Vertical jump wins were logged by Fabiana Murer in the vault (15-9 ¼/4.81) and by Ivan Ukhov with a tepid 7-6 (2.29) win in the high jump

The two shot put events were held a day earlier in the train station. Nadezhda Ostapchuk held on to her Diamond lead with a 20.63, ahead of Valerie Vili's 20.02.

In a non-Diamond competition, Christian Cantwell won with 71-9 (21.87) over Adam

A US 4x1 foursome of Trel Kimmons, Wallace Spearmon, Tyson Gay and Michael Rodgers used sparkling handoffs as well as speed in circling the track in 37.45 to win a grudge match against the Jamaican team of Mario Forsythe, Michael Frater, Steve Mullings, and Yohan Blake (37.76).

The US time was the No. 5 performance in history, and the fastest ever outside of Olympic or World Championships competition.
