

### — World Cross: 2 Bronze For U.S. —

Punta Umbria, Spain, March 20—Last year, a lot of pundits tagged Shalane Flanagan for a medal at the World Cross Country Championship but she came home 12<sup>th</sup>.

This year, however, there was no mistake and she beat the best that the rest of the world could offer, with the exception of the formidable Kenyan duo of Vivian Cheruiyot and Linet Masai.

The bronze medal deservedly earned by Flanagan was the first by a U.S. individual since Deena Kastor (then running under her maiden name of Drossin) finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the '03 race.

Flanagan battled at the front for the entire 8K, going through the halfway point in 12:41 at the head of a pack of 14.

Cheruiyot and Masai stepped up the pace in the fifth kilometer but Flanagan always looked comfortable as the leading group slimmed down to eight by the bell for

the last of the four 2K laps on flat parkland close to Spain's southern Atlantic coast.

Three Kenyans,—Cheruiyot, Masai and Priscah Jepleting—continued to dictate the tempo at the front during the penultimate kilo but when the '09 World 5K champ made her decisive break for home with about 800 to go, Flanagan saw her chance to get on the podium as well.

She went past the flagging Jepleting and also pulled away from Meselech Melkamu—the world's fastest 10K runner

the last two years—before crossing the line 25:10, 12 seconds in arrears of Cheruiyot but just three behind Masai, the '09 World 10K champ, who had to settle for the silver medal for the third successive year, being beaten by a different teammate each time.

Said the 29-year-old Flanagan, “I’ve never been in the top 10 before so I’m very grateful that I ran well and the team ran

me here.”

Her next targets are to reduce her 10K AR of 30:22.22, which has been on the books since '08, and to medal again at a global championship on the track, after her 10K bronze in Beijing.

“Now I'm going to switch over to track training as of tomorrow; there's no spring marathon,” she added. “Hopefully, I'll be in Daegu running a 10,000 then I look at another marathon later in the year. It's a possibility I'll look at doing the marathon in London at the Olympics next year.”

Flanagan was not the only U.S. woman to rise to the occasion. Molly Huddle and Magdalena Lewy Boulet, running together for most of the race, both improved two places on their '10 finish and came home 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> while the scoring quartet was completed by Blake Russell arriving immediately behind them in 19<sup>th</sup>.

The total of 57 points was easily enough for the Americans to take the team bronze the second consecutive year, with Kenya packing well enough to just score 15 points and comfortably beat eternal rivals Ethiopia.

Lewy Boulet, the U.S. women's team captain, said, “It was a tough race. The race seemed really fast, and the heat [in the low 70s at race time] made it that much harder. We were shooting for 2<sup>nd</sup>, and we made some strides. If we can come out and do this then that should encourage our top runners to participate in this race.”

The U.S. certainly had something to be proud about but their celebrations were dwarfed by those of cross country powerhouse Kenya.

The East African nation couldn't repeat its sweep of '10, when they took all 8 golds in an unprecedented display, but they did win 3 individual titles and 3 team contests.

The only top slots that evaded them

were the senior men's title, which went to Ethiopia's 12:53.58 track performer Imane Merga and the Junior women's team contest.

Africa's dominance of this event was not more forcibly demonstrated than in the Junior men's 8K race with Texas high school senior Craig Lutz being the first non-African-born runner home in 29<sup>th</sup>.

A combination of numbers and letters in parentheses, such as "9, x W" would mean the person had moved to No. 9 on the all-time world list, with a performance outside the top 10. Had it say, been the No. 9 performance, the notation would have been 9, 9 W.

You might also find something like "x, 6A". The x in the first position means the mark is not a PR, but the performance is No. 6 in U.S. history.

We note all-time list positions for World (W), U.S. (A), College (C), Juniors (WJ or AJ) and High School (HS).

We also denote yearly list leaders for the World (WL), U.S. (AL), College (CL) and High School (HS).
