

— Zürich Stages First Half Of DL Finals —

Zürich, Switzerland, September 8—The second season of the Samsung Diamond League reached half a climax at the Weltklasse gathering, where titles were decided in 16 of the circuit's 32 events.

to add a DL title to their '11 résumé.

Men's Events:

•**100:** DL leader Asafa Powell, who skipped the Worlds with a groin problem, got a good start, but world champ Yohan

talent by outdueling LaShawn Merritt in a PR 44.32, strengthening his hold as No. 2 Junior all-time. The pair ran 1–2 off the final bend but James pulled away in the last 50 with his relaxed strides.

"I executed the race perfectly," said the precocious Grenadian. "The conditions were better than in Daegu, so I was able to run my personal best."

•**1500:** DL leader and world champ Asbel Kiprop faded badly in the homestretch as Kenyan teammate Nixon Chepseba was a clear 3:32.74 winner from Daegu silver medalist Silas Kiplagat (3:33.56). Kiprop slowed to 7th in 3:34.89, losing the diamond to Chepseba.

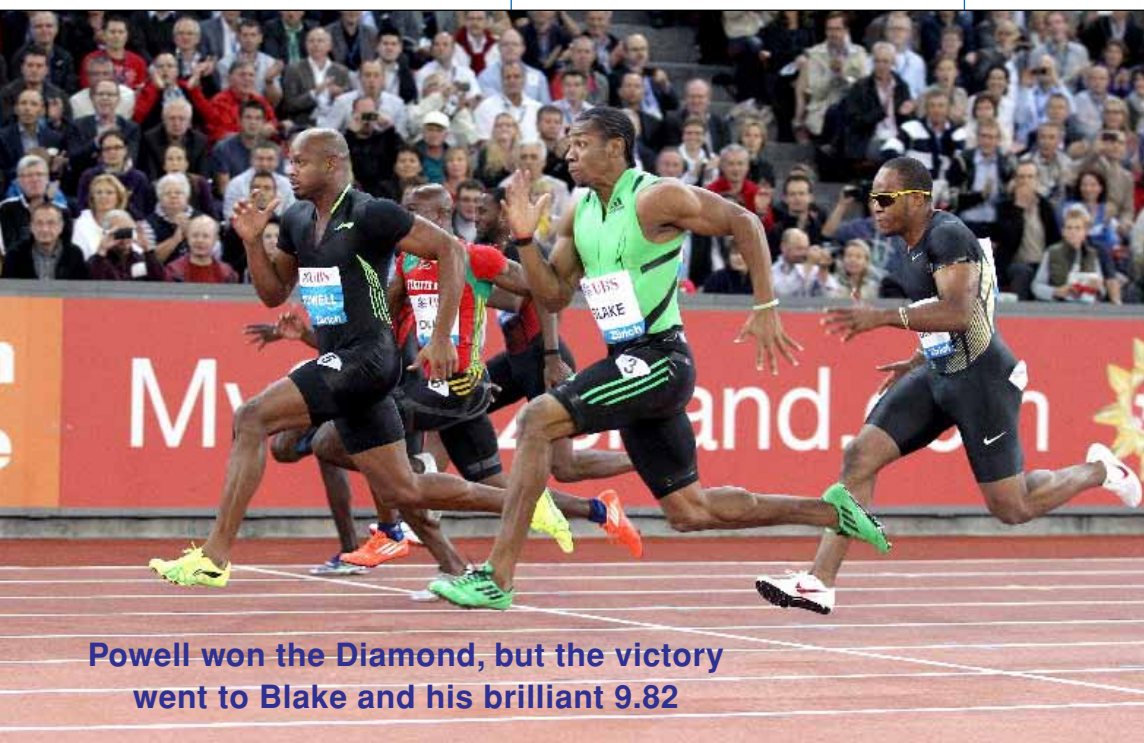
•**Steeple:** Daegu champ Ezekiel Kemboi and DL leader Paul Koech battled over the last half-lap, Kemboi

taking over at the final barrier to win in 8:07.72, 0.17 ahead of Koech, who nonetheless claimed the diamond.

•**110 Hurdles:** Dayron Robles gained some revenge for his Daegu DQ by edging world champ Jason Richardson 13.01–13.10. The pair ran evenly throughout the race, while AR holder David Oliver dropped back to 3rd (13.26) before midway.

Said the Cuban, "I felt great today [but] after the seventh hurdle I became too tight. Otherwise I would have run under 13. Still, it's a great satisfaction for me after Daegu."

•**High Jump:** World champ Jesse



Powell won the Diamond, but the victory went to Blake and his brilliant 9.82

Winners, some who had already wrapped up titles earlier in the circuit (but had to compete here to actually win), received a \$40,000 1st-place award plus a diamond-themed trophy.

The circuit's second-half champions will be crowned next Friday (September 16) in Brussels.

In the storied Swiss city, more than a few athletes appeared tired after a long season, as well as a long trip from Korea where the World Championships had concluded only four days previously.

Still, several Daegu winners triumphed

Blake came on hard in the second half to win in a PR 9.82 as Powell (9.95) once again seemed to slow in the final meters. Walter Dix (3rd at 10.04) dropped back after midway.

Blake moved to No. 7 on the all-time world list with his time, but adjusted for wind (0.0) and altitude (401m) on the *Big Gold Book* tables, the 9.82 converts to a 9.83, a mark only four others have ever bettered.

•**400:** In perhaps the race of the meet, Kirani James (racing for the first time as a 19-year-old) confirmed his world-champion

Williams made only 7-5¼ (2.28) but won the DL even though tied on points with Andrey Silnov. Williams' 4th over the Russian's 10th was the decider. Young Dimitrios Hondrokoúkis of Greece matched his PR of 7-7¼ (2.32) to win.

•**Long Jump:** Subdued distances saw Daegu bronze winner Ngoni Makusha win with just 26-3 (8.00). World champ Dwight Phillips reached only 25-10 (7.87) in 4th, while an admittedly-exhausted Mitchell Watt leaped a mere 22-10 (6.97) to finish 7th and last but still took the DL win.

•**Shot Put:** Staged downtown Wednesday in the main train station, a

cracking competition went to Worlds silver winner Dylan Armstrong whose final-round 70-11¼ (21.63) answered Ryan Whiting's final-frame 70-7¼ (21.52).

•**Discus:** Global champ Robert Harting hit 219-10 (67.02) on his second toss to supplant the 218-9 (66.69) opener by Virgilijus Alekna. But the Lithuanian still took the DL win.

Women's Events:

•**200:** Allyson Felix led Carmelita Jeter into the final straight, but the world 100 champ pulled even with about 75 meters left and won in 22.27, 0.13 ahead.

•**800:** Mariya Savinova began a charge midway in the final turn and collared leader Alysia Montañó with 30 meters to go to win by 0.14 in 1:58.41. Britain's Jenny Meadows ran 3rd (1:58.92) to secure the DL victory.

•**5000:** Double world champ Vivian Cheruiyot traded strides with Sally Kipyego over the closing 200, but her 60.4 final lap prevailed by 0.32 in a meet record 14:30.10.

•**400 Hurdles:** Kaliese Spencer made up for a Worlds 4th as her

53.36 handled the Daegu medalists: Melaine Walker (53.43), Lashinda Demus (54.04) and Natalya Antyukh (54.50).

•**Pole Vault:** Jenn Suhr topped a winning 15-5¼ (4.72) on her first try as DL leader Silke Spiegelburg needed two. But the German took the title, as Yelena Isinbaeva and world champ Fabiana Murer tied for 3rd at 15-1¼ (4.62).

•**Long Jump:** Daegu champ

•**Shot:** Also staged in the *hauptbahnhof*, the competition always was led by world champ Valerie Adams, whose 67-3½ (20.51) fifth effort bested Daegu medalists Nadzeya Ostapchuk (67-2¼/20.48) and Jillian Camarena-Williams (64-5¼/19.64).

•**Javelin:** Another to make up for a 4th-place disappointment in Daegu, Christina Obergföll hit a 226-2 (68.95) leader in round
