Slightly bizarrely, Blake was running out in lane 7 with Walter Dix behind him, but it was a decision of his own choosing.

"I can definitely run faster; I can definitely run the corner better, and getting out of the blocks, that was slow even for me; but Usain told me before the race 'Just be patient.' That's what I did because I can run the last 100 like crazy."

Spare a thought for Dix who clocked a 19.53 PR, but he finished 3 meters adrift of the flying Jamaican.

Dix produced the No. 6 time ever run, and the fastest ever runner-up finish. He jumped in front of Tyson Gay as the second-fastest American after Michael Johnson's former WR of 19.32.

Galen Rupp became the new AR holder over 10,000 when he took 3rd behind the comebacking Kenenisa Bekele, the Ethiopian clocking 26:43.16 in his first track finish in more than two years while Rupp crossed the line in 26:48.00 to take more than 11 seconds off Chris Solinsky's

League itself is worth very much is open to debate but there can be no arguing that its finale in the Belgian capital saw one heck of a meet.

Only minutes before Jamaica's 100 world champ world champ Yohan Blake went to his blocks in the 200, he watched training partner Usain Bolt speed to a world-leading 9.76 WL in the event where he was the surprise Daegu gold medalist.

Blake used it as inspiration to unleash a

mouthed, especially after Blake's agonizingly slow start, one which saw him the last man to leave his blocks, his reaction time given as a positively sluggish 0.269.

"I know I'm in good shape for the 200." admitted Blake, who had not run the distance since May. "I do the same training as Usain and when I saw him run 19.40 in Daegu, I knew I could run that sort of time. I knew I was capable of something crazy, but I was thinking about 19.5."

former AR and slice more than 20 seconds off his own previous low.

"I couldn't have been happier when I heard the pace to halfway was going to be 13:25," said Rupp. "I came here hoping for 13:30 or even a little bit under. I thought to myself, 'This is great, this sets things up so well for the second half of the race.' When we got to 5K in 13:26, I just put time out of my head and just focussed on competing.

"I knew some of the other guys in the leading pack were wanting to run fast and they were going to push, so I knew that if I was going to be with the leaders at the end then the time would take care of itself,"

Rupp told *T&FN*.

"I can't tell you how disappointed I was not to be able to run [the Diamond League meet] in Eugene, especially when I then saw what Mo [Farah, his training partner and 5000 world champ] did there so the American Record has been my target since then and we came here with it in mind," he added.

Morgan Uceny won the 1500 in a world-leading PR of 4:00.06, running a perfectly timed race to go past Morocco's Mariem Selsouli just before they entered the home straight and prove a point after falling in the 1500 final in Daegu.

"I didn't get quite up as far as I wanted to in the early stages of the race and I was stuck on the rail for a long time," reflected the Cornell alum, "but I kept my composure. I think I was 4th or 5th at the bell but I know I've got a good last lap."

However, the fact that no one broke 4:00 means that it will probably be the first year since '77 that barrier hasn't been broken.

Carmelita Jeter won her 100 in 10.78 to extend her dominance at the event. She has now won 9 of her 10 outings this season, and her only defeat came in Shanghai back on May 15.

In the field, the star performer was Russia's new world number one high jumper Anna Chicherova, who cleared 6-8¾ (2.05), a height only she has bettered this season.

Chicherova then had three good attempts at a World Record 6-10¾ (2.10), her second effort being particularly close, her torso well over and only dragging the bar off with her

calves.

A terrific competition shot saw former world champions Reese Hoffa and Christian Cantwell both go over 72-feet for the first time this year and make up slightly for finishing out of the medals in Daegu.

It was also the first, and probably only, competition of 2011 in which two men went over 22 meters.

Competing "just for fun" as Cantwell said, as Canada's world leader Dylan Armstrong had clinched the Diamond Race; Cantwell reached 72-5 (22.07) in the fifth round only to see Hoffa go 2cm further with his last effort. Cantwell went close with 71-10¾ (21.91) on the last attempt of the competition but it was not enough.
