

— Shobukhova To No. 2 All-Time In Chicago —

Chicago, Illinois; October 9—When Liliya Shobukhova won her first Chicago Marathon in '09 she ran like a track runner: with conservative pacing but a fast finish; so fast that you had to wonder if she was saving too much for the conclusion.

After running a stunning 2:18:20 to win her third consecutive Bank of America/Chicago title Shobukhova is now known as a great marathoner who has effectively applied her track speed to the full 26-mile distance as she became the event's second fastest ever, trailing only Paula Radcliffe (three times) on the all-time list.

The 33-year-old Russian admitted, "I'm shocked. I am so happy with my time especially as it is a new national record, and with my 3-peat in Chicago and selection for the London Olympics."

The reigning World Marathon Majors title holder also locked down her second WMM title and the \$500,000 prize.

In contrast to her previous wins in the Windy City, Shobukhova started briskly, clocking an opening 5K of 16:19 and with a steady stream of sub-5:25 miles she reached halfway in 69:25 (after clipping 26 seconds off the 30K World Record with her 1:38:23 at that point), a pace that only marathon debutante Ejegayehu Dibaba and Kayoko Fukushi had the gumption to follow.

"I think that to run sub-2:20 that you have to use new tactics and try something

else," Shobukhova offered. "That is why I tried to go fast right away with the aid of my track speed."

Immediately after halfway, she lifted the pace higher breaking away from Dibaba

erine Ndereba's 2:18:47 (a WR clocking when set in '01) into No. 2 on the all-time list.

"I don't experiment much with my training," Shobukhova said. "We do the same training each time, but the difference is more speed. According to our plan we were training for 2:19, so 2:18 was a surprise. My advice is to never be afraid to run faster than what your training shows."

•••

In the men's race, Moses Mosop backed up last spring's raucous debut in Boston by setting a course-record 2:05:37, a second better than the late Sammy Wanjiru's time from '09.

For the 26-year-old Kenyan, it was not so much a competition against competitors and the clock as it was a test of his ability to produce a victory off only five weeks of serious training. The immensely talented Mosop, who is called "the big engine" back home—based on his silver-medal finish in the '07 World Cross—has been bothered throughout his career by calf/Achilles injuries.

So when his calf acted up after his 30K track WR at Pre, Mosop did not resume full training until five short weeks before Chicago. At something around 80% fitness he managed to cover all moves, including Wesley Korir's sharp

acceleration at 30K.

Mosop countered by ripping off the next three miles in 4:35, 4:36 and 4:39: that sent him past 21 miles at 2:04:27 pace. The lack

and Fukushi while ripping off a string of 5:11/5:15 miles. Faltering just a bit over the final miles the Russian 5K recordholder managed a strong finish to move past Cath-

of competition and full fitness was evident as he slowed on the run-in yet he managed to get across the line a tick better than Wanjiru's old standard.

"It is in tribute to Sammy Wanjiru that I improve his course record," Mosop said, adding with some degree of certainty "if I was 100% I think I would run 2:02."
