

### — Major Matchups At Wisconsin/adidas —

Madison, Wisconsin; October 14—The “letter of the day” at the Wisconsin/adidas Invitational was clearly and easily a big “W,” not only for a ferocious wind but also for the results, where the pre-race team formchart held true for the men but took a real beating in the women’s race.

Ultimately, it meant that two of the big “W’s” of the sport each claimed a big “W” in one of the nation’s biggest meets on one of the newest hill-and-dale routes, the Zimmer Championship Cross Country Course (see sidebar).

Wisconsin’s men, running at full strength for the first time this year, showed their No. 2 national ranking behind two-time defender Oklahoma State is no fluke with a convincing 66-point win over BYU (120), Stanford (125) and 23 other teams ranked in the top 40.

But Greg Metcalf’s 24th-ranked Washington women threw a wrecking ball into

the rankings with a 199-point win off a 7-23-25-50-94 finish in the 44-team, 308-runner field.

Unranked Vanderbilt, clad in highly visible pink, claimed second with 211 points followed by No. 14 Arizona (230), Villanova (232) and Stanford (256).

“Our goal coming in was just to run

with five different runners capable of being the No. 1 man in any given race, was led this time by Virginia transfer Ryan Collins. The home team ran near the front from the get-go, led team scoring all the way and packed ‘em tight at the finish (11-12-13-14-16).

“They were so unselfish,” said Byrne. “They put aside their individual goals out there today and said, ‘Let’s all do this as a team.’ Every one of them had that zap in their legs for the first 2K.”

As Wisconsin’s 5 grouped quickly with the lead pack, they built a lead they would never relinquish.

“I was surprised,” Byrne said.

#### A National-Class Course

Wisconsin’s Thomas Zimmer Championship Course, which was carved two summers ago out of a meadow adjacent to the new University Ridge Golf Course on the southwest side of Madison, continues to draw raves from coaches and runners.

Its reputation, generated by word of mouth from those who’ve run it, assured a

stellar field that downsized the usual field for the official pre-nats meet two days later at Terre Haute.

This was the third year for the adidas meet, with the NCAA Great Lakes Regional slated for the Zimmer next year and Wisconsin coaches Mick Byrne and Jim Stintzi optimistic that the NCAA will be held there soon, perhaps as early as ’13 or ’14.

“At about 3K it looked like the team race was over. It didn’t seem like anyone was making a run at us. At that stage, it was about protecting where we were at and not doing any more than we had to.”

Highly touted Arizona frosh Lawi Lalang, runner-up in the track 5K last June, started fast and broke a men’s field laden with all-Americans and breezed to a course record 23:10.8 for the 8K route.

“Lawi showed he’s in a class of his own today,” Wildcat coach James Li said. “I don’t think tactically he was the most sound, he’s just so much stronger than everybody else. He did a great job and had a convincing win.”

Villanova’s Sheila Reid showed she’s ready to defend her national title next month, holding off Oregon arch-rival Jordan Hasay as they duelled alone over the last 2K to win in a record 19:59.4 for the 6K course.
