

— Desisa Ends Kenya's Boston Streak —

Hopkinton-to-Boston, April 15—The Boston Marathon at 117 continues to underscore the century-old tradition that it is this course—perhaps more than any other, that dictates the race strategy upon which Boston champions are crowned.

Ethiopia put a halt to Kenya 3-year hold on the men's champion's corner, as Lelisa Desisa claimed the laurel wreath in 2:10:22.

The 23-year-old Ethiopian made a furious rush over the final two kilometers, pulling away from Micah Kogo (2:10:27) and Gebre Gebremariam (2:10:28).

For the second consecutive year, Jason Hartmann closed well to grab 4th (2:12:12) and finish as the first American. Defending champ Wesley Korir ended up 5th (2:12:30).

Unlike the '12 scorcher when temperatures reached the high 80s, This Patriot's Day run was more pleasing to runners and spectators alike.

From the early stages right through to the finish, tactical formation was the game plan. No fewer than 9 Ethiopians and Kenyans made up the lead pack at halfway (1:04:54), which also included Hartmann and Canada's Robin Watson.

Desisa, whose only other marathon was a 2:04.45 victory in Dubai in January, took the lead just before the final turn onto Boylston Street, leading the final 600-meter stretch run to the finish.

"I understand [Kogo, Gebremariam & Korir] are very good track runners," said Desisa, who won the '11 half-marathon at the All-Africa Games and the 10,000 gold at the African Junior Championships. "But it is not today. Today is another day and I planned to win over them."

Kogo, the 10K bronze medalist in Beijing, was making his marathon debut. "At about 13 miles, if only it was... a slow pace. I have been running half marathons—59:07. It was quite quicker than when we started," said Kogo, who owns a 10K PR of 26:35 from the '06 Van Damme.

"After 22 miles, then 23, 24, 25 miles I was feeling strong, my arms swinging. But my legs were a little bit tired. For me it was about 25 miles to 26 miles. I came to realize

that it's quite hard," said Kogo.

With the late withdrawal of the top-ranked American men (Ryan Hall, Meb Keflezighi and Abdi Abdirahman), that left the hopes for a high finish to Hartman. He didn't disappoint, duplicating his place from a year ago.

Said the Boulder resident "When [the Kenyans and Ethiopians] caught us they definitely made strong moves. I told myself, 'Oh crap! Things are definitely picking up.' I just tried to stay within myself."

Hartman picked up a large blister about 6 miles into the race. "It's something I dealt with through the rest of the race," he said.

"But when you line up you come to do something and that's what I prepared myself to do. It was painful. But I blocked out the pain as much as I could."

Seven years removed from her first Boston victory in '06, and with the experience of four appearances at Boston, Kenya's Rita Jeptoo, extolling the virtue of patience, claimed her second title with a solid come-from-behind win in 2:26:35.

Early leader Yolanda Caballero of Colombia led through the half in 1:14:02.

By 30K, Portugal's Ana Dulce Felix had

taken control, extending her lead to 75 seconds over Jeptoo, who was running in a pack of 6, which included American standout Shalane Flanagan (4th) and defending champ Sharon Cherop.

Between 35 and 40K Jeptoo and Ethiopia's Meseret Hailu hammered out a 15:50 split while Cherop and Flanagan stayed close. "Today I was running like I was in 2006" said Jeptoo, whose 2:22.04 PR was registered at Chicago last year. "I have energy. I have a lot of energy because I was running really light."

Jeptoo's tactics were similar to her '06 victory, when she came from behind in the final 5 kilometers.

Flanagan (2:27.08), who was making her Boston debut, had difficulty responding to Jeptoo's surge during the final 5K. "It hurt a lot," said the multiple-time Massachusetts high school champion.

"My legs felt like jello and when she went, I just said you know, 'OK. Keep it close, keep it close and don't give them too much room.' But I was suffering and we still had quite a bit to go."
