

— Too-Fast Pace Can't Be Held In London —

London, England, April 21—Tsegaye Kebede mounted a stunning late race charge that sent him past a faltering Emanuel Mutai in the final mile to win the 2013 London Marathon in 2:06:04.

"It was a great day to run in the London Marathon and even better to win," offered the Ethiopian star, who crossed the finish line with a salute to the Boston community.

Kebede, 26, produced his second straight World Marathon Majors win since being left off the Olympic team, prevailing in a race that started as an all out assault on the World Record, then turned into battle of mere survival as the world's greatest field was fully humbled by the marathon distance.

The regal men's field blitzed the downhill-trending opening 5 miles in 23:04, a Wanjiruesque 2:00:57 pace, then settled into a more reasonable and steady 4:42/4:48 clip to reach 12 miles in 56:29, a 2:03:24 tempo.

Reason gave way to exuberance as the field sped across the Tower Bridge clocking a 4:34 for the 13th mile that dropped all but one pacer, and Olympic champions Stephen Kiprotich and Mo Farah whose half-marathon orientation effort surely opened his eyes to the spectator frenzy of racing in the streets, and the perils of a 61:34 opening half.

The lead pack of 8 sped on together through 16 miles until Emanuel Mutai

and Stanley Biwot surged forward with Feyisa Lilesa and Ayele Abshero covering the move, and Kebede, Wilson Kipsang, Geoffrey Mutai and Yared Asmeron left behind.

Much to the delight of London bookies,

this quartet of longshots quickly forged a 100-meter lead over a trio of heavy favorites and passed 18 miles in 1:24:40—2:03:20 pace.

Just when it seemed that four unheralded runners might challenge Patrick Makau's WR, the worm began to turn as the steady stream of sub-4:50 miles gave way to slowing pace.

Biwot tried to keep up the tempo and pared Lilesa and then Abshero from the lead group, and he held a 30-meter advantage over Mutai at 22 miles (1:44:01—2:03:58 pace) with Kebede still some 45 seconds in arrears.

Then in an instant Biwot's form broke and Mutai moved past his suffering rival and the course record holder seemed destined for his second triumph.

"I thought I might win today," Mutai recalled, "but then my hamstring began to cramp."

A 5:25 for the 25th mile signaled his distress, and the sudden appearance of Kebede in full run sealed his fate.

A half-mile from the finish, the Little Big Man of marathoning moved past the stricken Kenyan and sprinted triumphantly to his second London win.

Kebede admitted, "I had a little pain in my side during the early part of the race, but as time went on it got better and better. I could feel myself getting closer and closer to Mutai and that made me stronger."

The audacious pacing of the men's race sharply contrasted with the women's competition as they covered the opening 6 miles at

women were overtaken by wheelchair competitors and she was sent crashing to the pavement with far more disastrous consequences than the tumble in her gold medal effort last summer.

After politely waiting for Galena to gather herself, a pack of 10 crossed halfway in 1:11:49, then the Kenyan trio of Priscah Jeptoo, Edna Kiplagat and Florance Kiplagat began to press the pace and thinned the herd with a string of sub-5:17 miles reaching 20 miles in 1:47:25 (2:20:58 pace).

Jeptoo made her break with a 5:02 for the 21st mile and held form all the way home to claim her first WMM win, powered by a stellar 68:30 closing half.

"At 20 miles I felt strong and decided to go alone, and it wasn't until 25 miles that I felt I could win," said the Olympic silver medalist.

What Are All Those Symbols?

We realize that there is a lot of material to absorb in our agate ("agate" is jounalese for small-type results), so let's see if we can't clarify it a bit for you.

A combination of numbers and letters in parentheses, such as "9, x W" would mean tha the person had moved to No. 9 on the all-time world list, with a performance outside the top 10. Had it say, been the No. 9 performance, the notation would have been 9, 9 W.

You might also find something like "x, 6 A". The x in the first position means the mark is not a PR, but the performance is No. 6 in U.S. history.

We note all-time list positions for World (W), U.S. (A), College (C), Juniors (WJ or AJ) and High School (HS).

We also denote yearly list leaders for the World (WL), U.S. (AL), College (CL; Division I only) and High School (HS).
