

— Lausanne DL: Super High Jumping —

Lausanne, Switzerland, July 4—If track & field fans were unfamiliar with the name Bohdan Bondarenko before this week, they will surely be aware of the Ukrainian high jumper after the Athletissima meet, where he jumped a year-leading 7-10¾ (2.41).

Having set a PR of 7-8¾ (2.36) in winning Birmingham just 4 days earlier, Bondarenko jumped significantly higher to move to =No. 4 on the all-time world list, with the best-ever mark at a DL meet.

The 23-year-old Ukrainian boldly opened at 7-4¼ (2.24), clearing on first attempt, as he did at 7-6½ (2.30).

Most of the field exited the competition at 7-7¾ (2.33), with Bondarenko passing that height and only new U.S. champ Erik Kynard clearing.

Kynard missed his first at 7-8½ (2.35), but Bondarenko cleared on his first, leading the American to pass.

The bar then went to 7-9¼ (2.37) and Kynard retook the lead with a first-time clearance at the PR height, which made him the =No. 4 American ever.

But Bondarenko responded straight away by jumping a PR 7-10 (2.39) with a huge clearance over the bar. After one failure, Kynard then missed twice at an AR 7-10¾ (2.41) to exit the competition.

But Bondarenko, who by now was able to demand silence from the capacity crowd, then sailed over on his final attempt—the best jump in the world since '94.

In contrast to several of his other competitions this year when he has stopped jumping as soon as he won, Bondarenko continued by raising the bar to

a WR height of 8-¾ (2.46), but failed three times, albeit with very respectable attempts.

“It’s difficult to take in, jumping 2.41 really is something,” said Bondarenko, whose best before this year was just 7-7 (2.31). “I

know that improving on that will be very difficult, but I do feel I will get there.”

In the 100, double U.S. sprint champion Tyson Gay held off a strong challenge from Jamaica’s former WR holder Asafa Powell.

Aided by a perfect 2.0 wind, Gay ran 9.79 to Powell’s 9.88 season’s best.

Mike Rodgers (9.96) was 3rd, while former world champ Kim Collins PRed in 4th with a world age-37 best of 9.97.

Sandra Perković won her fifth DL competition of the year and in so doing won the overall Diamond Race in her event.

Her winning mark of 226-3 (68.96) was a Diamond League Record in a competition where 7 broke 62 meters (203-5), a first for a DL meet.

Like Perković, Abeba Aregawi was a class apart in the 1500 as she too wrapped up the Diamond Race for the year.

The Swede won comfortably in 4:02.11, more than a second and a half ahead of Ethiopia’s Sifan Hassan.

In both straightaway hurdles races, U.S. athletes filled the top four spots.

Dawn Harper-Nelson clocked a season’s best of 12.53 to finish ahead of Kellie Wells (12.58) and Lolo Jones (12.60), as Olympic champion Sally Pearson finished down in 7th (12.69).

The men’s barriers were a non-DL event, but David Oliver clocked a world-leading 13.03 to win from Jason Richardson, Ryan Wilson and David Payne, the last falling awkwardly over the finish line and

breaking a femur.

Ethiopians dominated the distances. Mohammed Aman won the 800 in 1:43.33, while Yewew Alamirew took the 5000 in 13:06.69. Hiwot Ayalew set a meet record of 9:17.66 to win the women's steeplechase.

Another MR was broken in the shot as Ryan Whiting avenged his Birmingham defeat, beating Reese Hoffa 71-9½–70-9¾ (21.88–21.58).

— Paris DL: Blazing Bolt 200 —

St.-Denis, France, July 6—Having paid a reported \$300,000 for the services of Usain Bolt, the Paris Diamond League organizers gave him the role of providing the finale to the night and he earned his money with a 200 win in a world-leading 19.73.

In fact, it was the fastest furlong ever seen in the French capital, but it was not the effortless and fluid display that the Jamaican has produced on so many occasions in the last five years.

His sluggish reaction in lane 6 meant he was the second-slowest man out of the blocks.

Compatriot Nickel Ashmeade, two lanes to his inside, had a flying start and Bolt took 70 meters to get in front around the bend.

It was then the turn of another Jamaican, London bronze medalist Warren Weir (7), to put the WR holder under some pressure before the latter moved away in the final 50 meters, with Weir holding on for 2nd in 19.92, the No. 3 time of his career.

Anyone running 19.73 deserves plenty of plaudits and respect but Tyson Gay, after his feats this season, will have seen enough from this race to boost his confidence and give him genuine hope that he can challenge Bolt in Moscow next month

Said Bolt, "As you see, I'm getting there. I still need to work on a few mistakes; my coach will determine what exactly it will be. It's all building up towards a great World Championships. You will see a big show there, it will be the climax and I want to be ready for that."

A great evening of track which saw four world-leading marks and three meet records started early in the program with a thrilling head-to-head in the 400 between Grenada's Olympic/World champion Kirani James and his predecessor as champion at both events, LaShawn Merritt.

As has become usual in their duels since the start of '11, Merritt got out fast.

However, unlike at Pre when the American prevailed, James kept in close contact and edged in front halfway down the back straight.

Merritt pushed James all the way to the line but the youngster produced the No. 2 time of his career in 43.96. Merritt came home in 44.09, his best time since he won at the '09 WC.

Ethiopia's Tirunesh Dibaba ran an outstanding 5000 in 14:23.68, a world-leading mark and meeting record as well as the 7th fastest run ever over the distance and the quickest run by the WR holder since '08, they year she won Olympic gold.

Pacemaker Gabriele Anderson took the leaders through 2K in 5:45.20. Dibaba then towed her compatriots Gelete Burka and Almaz Ayana thru 3000 in 8:40.53.

Ayana pushed the pace for most of the next two laps before Dibaba went to the front again and held her place there until the line, kicking away from Ayana with 300 to go.

Ayana, best known before Saturday as a steeplechaser, took nearly half-a-minute off her best to finish 2nd in 14:25.84 to move up to No. 6 on the all-time list.

Kenya's Olympic champion Ezekiel Kemboi uncorked the first sub-8:00 steeple of the year when he sped away from France's London silver medalist Mahiedine Mekhiss-Benabbad with 250 to go before winning in 7:59.03.

However, Mekhiss-Benabbad raised the roof of the Stade de France—which hosted the '03 World Championships—as he held on to set a European Record of 8:00.09, improving the former mark of 8.01.19 which since '09 had belonged to his countryman Bob Tahri.

The two other races over barriers were also big news with the winners taking the honours in different ways.

Zuzana Hejnova took her unbeaten streak to seven races this year with an impressive 53.23 Czech Record to add to her burgeoning status—with world leader Kori Carter not on the US team—as favorite for the world title.

Aries Merritt has struggled with a sore hammy since the Shanghai DL in mid-May but the WR holder now seems to be past the worst after winning in 13.09.

He reacted fastest to the gun but was chased to the line by France's 21-year-old talent Pascal Martinot-Lagarde, who was second in a big PR of 13.12. One of the deepest races ever saw a record 8 men run 13.26 or faster.

Burundi's Francine Niyonsaba, 6th in the London 800 last summer and still just 20, hit the front with 50 meters to go and won in 1:57.26, a time only she has beaten this year.

The best mark in the field got a big cheer as France's Olympic champion Renaud Lavilénie bounced back failing to clear a height in Lausanne two days earlier, and had a clean sheet all the way up to and including 19-5 (5.92) before three failures at a meet record of 19-9 (6.02).

What Are All Those Symbols?

We realize that there is a lot of material to absorb in our agate (“agate” is jounalese for small-type results), so let’s see if we can’t clarify it a bit for you.

A combination of numbers and letters in parentheses, such as “9, x W” would mean tha the person had moved to No. 9 on the all-time world list, with a performance outside the top 10. Had it say, been the No. 9 performance, the notation would have been 9, 9 W.

You might also find something like “x, 6 A”. The x in the first position means the mark is not a PR, but the performance is No. 6 in U.S. history.

We note all-time list positions for World (W), U.S. (A), College (C), Juniors (WJ or AJ) and High School (HS).

We also denote yearly list leaders for the World (WL), U.S. (AL), College (CL; Division I only) and High School (HS).
