

— Zürich DL: 16 Diamond Races Decided —

Zürich, Switzerland, August 29—Part 1 of the IAAF Diamond League's season No. 4 ended, as in all previous years, at the famous Weltklasse meeting, where half of the tour's 32 events were decided.

The winners, four of whom had already wrapped up their titles before they got to Zürich and only needed to show up in the Swiss city, received a \$40,000 award plus a special diamond-themed trophy worth approximately \$12,000.

In addition, it was an especially lucrative night for athletes like the '13 WC gold medalists LaShawn Merritt and David Oliver because they also won another \$10,000 for coming home first in their events on the night.

In contrast to a few recent editions of the Weltklasse, notably 12 months ago, the conditions were ideal for good performances as the night was dry and temperatures between 67 and 73 (19–23C).

The second final will come Friday in Brussels.

Men:

100: Usain Bolt returned to action for the first time since Moscow and reeled off a routine-for-him win in 9.90.

After a typically sluggish start, he got into gear over the second half of the race and pulled away from his challengers.

Fellow Jamaican Nickel Ashmeade was 2nd in 9.94 while Moscow silver medalist Justin Gatlin finished 3rd in 9.96 to get enough points to win the Diamond Race.

400: One of the best races of the night saw 'WC winner Merritt go out hard and by halfway he had a clear advantage over his

arch-rival Kirani James.

The Grenadian star tried to come back at him over the second furlong but Merritt had enough in reserve to win in 44.12 and snatch the diamond from James's 44.32.

1500: After some quick pacemaking early in the race, with the leaders going through in 1:51.25, Kenya's Silas Kiplagat came out of a tightly-bunch pack off the final bend and had enough speed in his legs to carry him home in a season's best of 3:30.97.

Djibouti's Ayanleh Souleiman had the overall clinched before he went to the start line but came home next in 3:31.64.

It was a poor night for U.S. runners Matthew Centrowitz and Leo Manzano, who never featured at the sharp end and finished 12th and 14th.

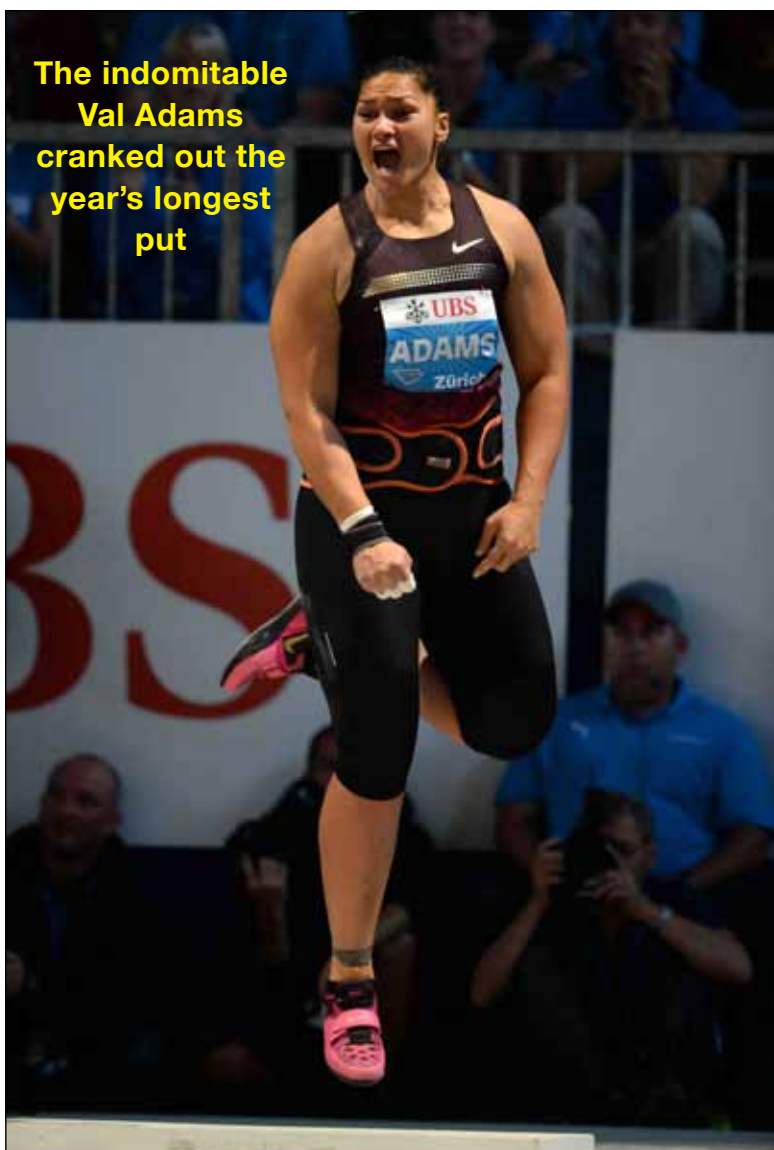
Steeple: After a quick opening kilo in 2:39.26 by rabbit Haron Lagat, nobody seemed interested continuing to go for a sub-8:00 and Stockholm winner Hilary Yego, who failed to make the Kenyan team for Moscow, continued his good late-season run of form with victory here in 8:08.03.

Moscow silver medalist Conseslus Kipruto hung on for 3rd in 8:10.76, which was just enough to give him the overall title by 1 point from Yego.

After his DNF in Stockholm, 3-time world champion Ezekiel Kemboi turned in another dismal performance back in 10th.

110H: Oliver put together his third consecutive DL win and skimmed

over the barriers in 13.12 to take the Diamond Race. Just like in Moscow, Ryan Wilson (13.24) came home behind Oliver.

High Jump: Bohdan Bondarenko only needed two jumps to win the contest and the Diamond Race, and only took three in total. He went cleanly over 7-5¼ (2.28) and then 7-7¾ (2.33). He passed 7-8½ (2.35) and, with the contest won, had the bar put up to a WR 8-¾ (2.46) at which he had one half-hearted attempt to please the crowd.

Greece's Konstadinos Baniótis and Qatar's Mutaz Essa Barshim also cleared 7-7¾ on their first attempts but had failures earlier in the competition and once they brought the bar down three times at 7-8½ they were placed 2nd and 3rd.

Long Jump: South Africa's Zarck Visser, who did not even make the Moscow final, was the surprise winner when he hit his sweet spot with a leap of 27-3¾ (8.32) in the 3rd round, into a 0.8 mps breeze, to add 3cm to his lifetime best.

Gold medalist Aleksandr Menkov was down in 6th with 26-¾ (7.94) but understandably had his thoughts elsewhere as he had already wrapped up the Diamond Race and had celebrated the birth of his first child just a few days before.

Shot: This was not a DL final but Ryan Whiting's win in Zurich's main railway station the evening before the main meeting was a nice warmup before he makes the trip to Brussels next Friday.

Whiting found the form that slightly escaped him in Moscow with a tremendous series of 71-5¼, 70-9¼, 72-2, 72-3¼, 68-10¾, 71-10¾ (21.77, 21.57, 21.99, 22.03, 21.00, 21.91); four of his efforts being better than Germany's 2-time world champion David Storl, who reached 69-6¼ (21.19) in the third round before finishing off with three fouls.

It doesn't happen much in August, but Whiting (as Val Adams would on the women's side) claimed the yearly world indoor lead.

Discus: Both Piotr Małachowski and 3-time world champ Robert Harting literally threw away their chances of taking the \$40,000 first prize as Gerd Kanter sneaked in and grabbed the cash with a season's best of 219-10 (67.02).

Harting ran him close but 219-2½ (68.83) for 2nd was not good enough and Małachowski, the Moscow silver medalist, was down in 7th with a relatively modest 209-0 (63.70).

Women:

200: Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce sizzled around the bend and kept on motorizing down the straight to win in 22.40, which added a diamond to the Jamaican's world title. She overtook Murielle Houré (22.66) both on the track and in the standings.

800: With pre-Zurich leader Francine Niyonsaba unable to come to the line due to injury, the dash for cash was wide open and eventually the race ended in similar fashion to the World Championships with Kenya's Eunice Sum having a better finish than Russian rival Mariya Savinova to win on the night and the Diamond Race overall, the pair timed at 1:58.82 and 1:58.93.

5000: It was the matchup that had been missing in Moscow after the Ethiopian federation twisted the arms of Meseret Defar and Tirunesh Dibaba to only run one event each, but Zürich was able to put enough money on the table to make the eagerly anticipated head-to-head happen.

How much? No one was saying. "But it was a lot of money, it cost us a lot," admitted meet director Patrick Magyar. He was rewarded with possibly the best race of the night, featuring a climactic last 1K.

Dibaba did her best to take the sting out of Defar's finish by cranking up the speed from 650 meters but Defar stayed hard on the heels of her rival, and looked comfortable, despite the ever-increasing tempo and went past her compatriot coming off the bend.

With the last kilo covered in a blistering 2:40.68, Defar uncorked a 58.3 last lap enroute to winning in 14:32.83, with Dibaba 2nd in 14:34.82. Back in 7th, Jenny Simpson broke 15:00 for the first time with a 14:56.25 that made her No. 10 American ever.

400H: Zuzana Hejnová had already won the overall before she arrived but the Czech extended her unbeaten streak to 11 races as she won in 53.32, getting in front by the second hurdle and never being headed.

Pole Vault: Silke Spiegelburg has an unenviable record of finishing 4th at major championships but the German was in the money, clearing a season's best 15-8½ (4.79) to win a Diamond Race which had no less than four potential winners.

She was flawless up to and included her winning height before finding a German Record 15-11¼ (4.86) too much. Jenn Suhr came in at 15-1¼ (4.62) but had one failure before retiring with an injured groin.

Long Jump: Great Britain's Shara Proctor won with her third-round 22-7 (6.88) and that was enough to give her the diamond. Brittney Reese could have taken the honors if she had won but was badly out-of-sorts and could only manage 20-10¾ (6.37) in 7th.

Shot: Adams reeled off her best series of the year that included three throws over and headed by her second-round 68-9½ (20.98), the best distance in the world this year and

her 41st consecutive victory

She won by over a meter despite Russia's '12 OG silver medalist Yevgeniya Kolodko uncorking a season's best of 65-6½ (19.97). Michelle Carter was just a centimeter away from Jill Camarena-Williams' indoor AR with 65-2¾ (19.88) in 3rd.

Javelin: Russia's Mariya Abakumova has been making up for letting her nerves get the better of her in Moscow and only ending up with the bronze. For the third consecutive meet since the Worlds she was a convincing winner over gold medalist Christina Obergföll.

On this occasion, there was more than 5 meters between the two other them as all five of Abakumova's valid throws were better than Obergföll, topped by her third round 226-2 (68.94).

Non-DL Events:

Men's 800: Moscow silver medallist Nick Symmonds showed that he's still fresh with a win in 1:43.56, his 3rd best time ever, hitting the front just before the final furlong and never letting go. Poland's Marcin Lewandowski was 2nd in a PR 1:43.79

Women's 100: In the best of two races, designed for the relay runners to stretch their legs, Jamaica's Carrie Russell sped to a PR of 10.98, with Alex Anderson close behind in 11.02.

Women's 4 x 100: A U.S. team of Barbara Pierre, Anderson, Tiffany Townsend and Charonda Williams got the baton round in a met record of 41.67 to beat a Jamaican quartet, with Fraser-Pryce on the anchor leg.
