Lindgren and Matson: 4 Wins, 3 Records

Bloomington, Ind., June 16-18--Randy Matson and Gerry Lindgren, who are seasoned Olympians, finally had their chance to compete in the NCAA championships and easily won two events apiece, Matson setting meet records in the shot (67'1½") and the discus (197'0"), and Lindgren setting a record in the three-mile (13:33.8) on Saturday after winning the six-mile in 28:07.0 two days earlier. UCLA ran away with the team title in this 45th NCAA meet, scoring 81 points to Brigham Young's 33. The team score was the fifth largest ever made in this meet and was accomplished by 11 Uclans who scored in 11 of the 20 events.

The tremendous effort that UCLA made for team honors was uncontested this year, quite the opposite of the 1965 battle that ended in a tie between Southern California and Oregon. USC was sixth here with 28 points and Oregon finished seventh with 23. Despite the team runaway, the meet had a little of everything including disappointments, surprises, mass disqualifications and the rarity of a disqualification being overruled.

The latter occurred in the high hurdles final when Ron Copeland of UCLA was disqualified for "trailing his foot below the plane of a hurdle." The new Indiana University grass-turf track has ten 48" lanes with the 42"-wide hurdles, leaving six-inch spaces between the hurdles in each flight. Running in lane seven, Copeland was reported by inspectors to have dipped his trailing foot below the hurdle plane into this opening. The inspectors' report was accepted by meet referee Tom Deckard, former Indiana distance star, and Copeland was disqualified. After a formal appeal was lodged by Jim Bush, UCLA coach, a meeting of the NCAA Track and Field Rules Committee was held on the track during Saturday's performances to investigate the possibility of this offense occurring. The committee unanimously agreed to overrule the original decision and Copeland was declared the winner 18 hours after the race was run. It was the most popular decision with the crowd of 8000.

Only two of 12 returning individual champions were successful defenders, John Fiore of Boston College in the hammer throw and Charlie Greene of Nebraska in the 100. Fiore produced a career-best throw of 201'3½" and became the second man to reach 200'0" in an NCAA meet, John Lawlor of Boston U having done it in 1959 and 60.

Greene retained his 100-yard dash title by beating a fast field which included 220 world record holder Tommie Smith. Greene and Smith won their heats in meet-record-tying times of 9.3 on the first day. Greene took his semi in 9.4 on the next day while Smith couldn't quite catch Jim Freeman of Murray State in the other semi, both also doing 9.4. In the final, Greene and Freeman were together for 30 yards with Greene then pushing ahead. After his usually poor start, Smith came on strong in the last 20 yards to take Freeman for second but had no track left to catch Greene. Champ Charlie predicted his win figuring that he had too much early speed for late-starting Smith. Lynn Headley, also of Nebraska, placed in the final for the third year in a row, taking fifth behind Rene Matison of New Mexico.

By the time the 220 was run on Saturday, Tommie Smith was no longer able even to make an attempt at setting a record in his specialty. Smith had won an easy 220 heat in 20.2w on Thursday, floating away from the field. On Friday he placed third in the long jump with two jumps, two fouls and two passes: ran the 100 semis, and placed second in the 100 final. Then on Saturday he was anchoring his San Jose State 440-yard relay team and was moving them up from fifth place when he suffered a slight pull in the upper right thigh 20 yards from the finish. He brought his team in third in this race but scratched from the semi-final of the 220, which was run a half hour later. So, instead of a potential of three individual and one team victories, Smith settled for a second (100), a third (long jump), a team third (440 relay) and a scratch (220).

With the 220 final wide open, defending champ Earl Horner of Villanova no longer had to worry about Tommie Smith but found a new menace in Tom Jones of UCLA. In the final, Jim Lee of Maryland got off to a good start but Jones picked up on him after the curve and moved away from the crowd to win in 20.9. Horner moved in to take

a close second ahead of a tightening Lee.

Texas A&M's Matson's winning shot put of 67'1½" followed his day-old record of 65'6¼" in the qualifying round. Although this was only his seventh best throw, his series of F, 67'1½", 66'6", 65'10½", 66'5¾", F, was his second best, being surpassed only by the tremendous 1965 series in which he set his world record of 70'7¼". The shot put event had the three top-ranking shot putters in the world who are still competing (excepting Gary Gubner who has competed three since 1964) in Matson, Oregon's Neill Steinhauer and BYU's Mike Bianco, and they finished in that order. Steinhauer reached 64'½", and the next three men also passed 60'0". These were the best five-place distances ever made in an NCAA meet. Matson is still not satisfied with his weight which is some 15-pounds below normal after a long basketball season. He may not compete in that sport next winter. Matson's discus victory made this the first time since 1931 that a man has won both the shot and discus in an NCAA meet.

The other double winner, Washington State's Gerry Lindgren, had things pretty much his own way in both the six- and three-mile runs. The six was the only final on the first day of the meet. Dick Sharkey of Michigan State went way out at the gun and built up more than a 50 yard lead at the mile with Gerry third in 4:36.9. Oscar Moore of Southern Illinois took over at two-miles, followed closely by Lindgren (9:15.8), and Gerry assumed the lead at three-miles in 14:04.2. From that point on it was just a matter of how much of a margin Lindgren wanted to set up. He won the race by about 80 yards. In the three-mile two days later, Lindgren took the lead early and was chased by Oscar Moore, who dropped out before the two-mile mark, Geoff Pyne of UCLA, John Lawson of Kansas and Lindgren's teammate Chris Westman. Gerry led this quartet for two-miles and then gradually pulled away to win by some 60 yards in 13:33.8. Westman and Lawson put on a spirited battle for second throughout the last lap, with Lawson victorious by about four yards. The place winners in both races were nearly the same men: Pyne was second in the six and fourth in the three; Lawson was third and second; Westman was fifth and third.

One of the meet's best performances was the intermediate hurdling of Michigan State's Bob Steele. His best previous time was 50.7 that won the Big 10 championships. Looking exceptionally strong Steele took his heat in 51.4, ran away with a semi final in 50.1 (fastest time by an American in two years) and beat UCLA's Roger Johnson by 0.6 in the final with 50.4. This event was marked by 10 disqualifications of runners for dipping the trailing leg below the plane of a hurdle. The principal victim was Oxy's Vance Peterson who placed second last year. The 1965 winner, San Diego State's Larry Godfrey was eliminated in the semi-finals.

In the middle distances, Peter Scott of Nebraska won the 880 in 1:47.9, preserving strength in a highly competitive series of heats and semi-finals and having more left for the third half-mile in three days than did his rivals. The pre-final favorite of many was Georgetown's Ricky Urbina who had won his heat and semi by coming from next to last around the final curve and pouring in on the stretch to barely win each race by a yard. In the final, Scott was in control and had the stretch drive capacity to hold off Rick Herrmann (San Diego State) who did 1:48.3, and Urbina who did 1:48.5, to win by four yard.

Despite the absence of injured defending champ Bob Day of UCLA, the mile was an excitingly close race. Dave Patrick, Villanova sophomore, led the dozen finalists through a 61.0 quarter, with Tom Von Ruden of Oklahoma State taking the lead at the half in 2:02.8. Patrick took over again at the three-quarter mark to post a 3:05.8. Early in the backstretch of the gun lap, Oregon's Wade Bell took the lead, passing Von Ruden and Patrick. Von Ruden then passed Patrick and Bell at the turn and led from the top of the curve and down the stretch. About 25 yards from the finish line Patrick drove past the leader to win by three yards in 4:02.1 to 4:02.4. Texas' Richard Romo had moved up to fourth and ahead of Notre Dame's Ed Dean in the backstretch, held on around the curve and down the stretch to take Bell by a yard at the tape (4:02.7 to 4:02.9) to finish third with a last lap of 55.9. The first four men finished within 0.8 second and two of them (Patrick and Romo) had personal bests as Washington's Dave Roberts (sixth in 4:06.0) surprised following a 4:05.8 personal best.

In the remaining running events, the 440 was won by Southern California's Dwight Middleton who ran his usual come-from-behind race to catch defending champ Jim Kemp, who ran out of gas with his also normal keep-out-in-front race. The injury-riddled Middleton won both his heat and semi with the same tactic and had the fastest time of the meet (46.2) in his semi in which he beat Kemp. In the final, Nebraska's Dave Crook followed Middleton and came up fast toward the tape, also catching the fading Kemp to slide into second place. A wave of three more men, Riley Dunn (ACC), Mike Mondane (Iowa) and Larry Hengl (Cal), swept in to a photo finish together with a picture showing Dunn and Mondane in a tie for fourth. All four men behind Middleton (46.3) and Crook (46.4) were timed in 46.9.

The steeplechase was an easy win for Bob Richards of Brigham Young who was running only his fourth obstacle course. Richards' time of 8:51.6 and his defeat of such experienced men as last year's winner Bruce Mortenson (Oregon) and Jack Bachelor (Miami, Ohio) attest to his vast improvement and great potential. Ken Moore of Oregon was bothered by a cold and finished sixth.

The field events had six winners returning from last year and only one of them, Fiore, was able to win his event again. Frank Costello's loss to Otis Burrell in the high jump was not unexpected, as Burrell has been consistently over seven-feet as he was here (7'1"). Pole vaulter Bill Fosdick (Southern Cal) has been injured this year and didn't even place here, with Colorado's Chuck Rogers taking the event at 16'0" on fewer misses than favorite Marc Savage.

The triple jump had some excellent performances with four men going beyond 51-feet. Craig Fergus' win was according to form but Penn State soph Chip Rockwell's 51'1" (second) was unexpected as was Toledo soph Aaron Hopkin's 51'1" (third). Fergus' winning effort of 51'3" is the second-best winning mark, behind Charles Craig's 51'8" in 1964.

The principal field event surprise was the javelin victory of Jim Stevenson of Penn State who reached 258'5" and beat defender and strong favorite John Tushaus of Arizona by more than a foot. Tushaus had set an American record of 284'0" earlier this year and had a throw of about 265-feet called flat here. Stevenson's winning throw was his second trial toss. He passed his three final throws with the knowledge that he rarely betters a good mark, that his arm was sore and that Tushaus might be bothered by the boldness of his passing after a throw of "only" 258'5". Whether the strategy worked or not, Stevenson won the championship.
