1978 Opens With Records Galore

Admittedly, the first full season of automatic timing and the increased use of metric distances have combined to produce a welter of new records. You can ignore those if you choose.

But you certainly can't ignore the biggies. Numero uno, the mile mark, has toppled, as have the vault and the high jump (not once, but twice) at the world level.

The mile was a real shocker. Dick Buerkle, semi-retired for most of 1977, suddenly decided that this 5000 man was now a miler. He made a bold move first in the Ali 1500 (56.8, 1:56.5, 2:56.8), forging a monstrous lead which he couldn't quite hold. Not daunted, he came right back the next weekend at CYO (57.2, 1:58.9, 2:58.3) and did the same thing. This time, he held the pace and astounded the track world with a 3:54.9 clocking, nipping 0.1 off Tony Waldrop's old standard.

It wasn't really too surprising when the vault mark came down. Even at 18-3/4 it had become a relatively soft standard. Mike Tully added 1/4" to that one.

Surprises again abounded in the high jump, where Montreal silver medalist Greg Joy, who says he now has a vertical jump of 60", slid over 7-7 at CYO. He had to clear that height, as at that point he was behind mighty mite Franklin Jacobs, who had cleared 7-6.

Jacobs' turn came a couple of weeks later at the Millrose. He had said that he could jump 7-8 (a height he had passed at CYO after Joy's clearance); he was just waiting for a Garden meet. He didn't make 7-8, but did settle for a new WR of 7-7 1/4. "I don't think I'll jump at a record height again this winter unless I need to do it to win," he said. Jacobs, by the way, was recently measured by Eastern Editor Bob Hersh. And he's a legit 5-8, which means he has now gone a stupendous 23 1/4" over his head. Ron Livers was the old champ at 19 1/4".

There was spectacular high jumping on the women's side also, as the CYO floor also found Joni Huntley coming back to her form of 1975 and setting ARs of 6-3 and 6-4. Only Rosemarie Ackermann has ever jumped higher indoors. Still, Huntley mused about Jacobs, "I'm 5-8. How come I can't jump that high?"

High jumping has been spectacular all around, still leading one to wonder if gravity isn't lessening.

Automatic timing has produced a spate of new marks, but under

any system Houston McTear would still stand out, so swift is he out of the blocks. He has nailed both 60 standards, 6.11 for yards, 6.54 for meters.

Europe has gotten off to a terribly slow start indoors, creating nothing to shout about.

Down-under action has been good, most of it instigated by visitors. Such as Henry Rono, who ran 27:48.6 in a vain attempt on the world record.

Prep results of the top rank are few and far between, as the harsh weather has really taken its toll.

STATUS QUO

'75 AAU Cross Country champ Lynn Bjorklund is back home in Albuquerque after attending Seattle Pacific last year. She is taking some classes at New Mexico and is attempting to train after a long series of leg injuries which have been diagnosed any number of ways. . .

Oregon lost 6-11 frosh high jumper Phillip Christian to knee surgery after he slipped in a shower. . .

Rod Ewaliko, the leading U.S. javelinist in '77, looks better than ever, say our Northwest spies, with 300 feet just around the corner. In a mid-January workout, throwing from an abbreviated runup, he hit 287-5. Fellow throwers say that not only does he appear stronger, faster and more technically sound, but he also has a great attitude and competitive fire. . .

Washington picked up JC decathlete Gary Gefre (6882 last year at Yakima Valley—including falling in the highs but also 215-0 in the javelin). He will have three years of eligibility. . .

Franklin Jacobs hurt a knee cartilage three days before the CYO meet and was on crutches for two days. "I wasn't even sure I could jump," says the diminutive recordman, "but it felt good after I warmed up." Good enough for a PR 7-6. . .

Texas' Johnny Jones, who suffered a leg muscle injury in the Cotton

Bowl, is taking it slow in track training and may not compete indoors at all. . .

Larry Myricks, who hasn't long jumped since breaking his ankle while warming up for the Olympic finals, is back doing sprint and track workouts and will begin jumping drills any time. He is still a junior. . .

Long-time fans will recall the problems that befell those who made the cover of the NCAA Guide a few years back. There was a while there when they never seemed to end up competing for their schools. Add Missouri's Nat Page, the 1978 coverboy, to those ranks. He is going to redshirt this year, preferring to save a year of eligibility for 1980 to aid his Olympic training. Color him UCTC for the year. . .

Allegheny CC's Kenyan frosh James Rotich was a hot cross country runner, but we neglected to give you his track credentials. He's fast: 13:37.9. . .

Karin Smith reportedly will train in West Germany for part of this season with the USC Munich club. She will be coached by Siegfried Becker, husband and coach of Olympic silver medalist Marion Becker. . .

Prep star Tony Uzdavines (Williamstown, NJ), 1:53.3, is at Maryland.

Oregon's Dave Voorhees, tabbed by some as a possible NCAA shot/discus double winner, is apparently having problems with sore knees. He sat out 1977 after surgery.

Rosemarie Ackermann had a foot operated on in January and was in a cast for several weeks. She won't compete at all indoors. . .

Olympic 20-kilo walk champ Daniel Bautista aggravated an Achilles tendon while in Puerto Rico training and had to curtail training in mid-January while his foot was immobilized in a cast. . .

Distance stars Filbert Bayi and Miruts Yifter both received military promotions at the end of the year, Bayi to captain and Yifter to lieutenant. . .

Danie Malan got a big laugh out of our report that he was considering trying for Dutch citizenship, reports correspondent Org Potgieter. Malan has retired completely and doesn't even have time to jog. He operates a farm in export grapes.

Rumanian high hurdler Ervin Sebestyen, who defected during a trip to Western Europe last fall, has been granted political asylum in Switzerland. He ranked 15th in the world in 1977. . .

Hammer world record holder Walter Schmidt has announced his retirement from international competition. He says he will compete only for his club as a hobby. . .

Former discus recordman John Van Reenen recently suffered only his 2nd defeat by another South African in the past umpteen seasons (at least 10). Peter Goosen threw 189-11 to 179-5 for Big John. Van Reenen says he isn't training seriously since South Africa has been officially banned from international competition. . .

Dutch high jump star Ruud Wielart broke a toe on his left foot

shortly after clearing 7-5 last year. He was not able to jump well the rest of the year. He took time to let the foot heal and he is now "really anxious to get back to training." . .

Knut Hjeltnes, one of the five world-class athletes caught by steroid testing, received a one-year ban by the Norwegian Federation. He will be able to compete again on July 6, a year from the date of his first violation—that is unless the IAAF prolongs his suspension. . .

It is uncertain whether Montreal 5000 3rd-placer Klaus-Peter Hildenbrand of West Germany will compete in '78. He underwent his third tendon operation in December. He ran only very early in the '77 season before his first operation, which was thought successful. But it apparently wasn't, so a 2nd was needed to repair the damage caused by the first. "I have just about written off '78," says Hildenbrand. . .

Walker Bernd Kannenberg, '72 Olympic 50k champ, underwent another tendon operation and hopes to compete without pain this year. . .

Olympic 1500 bronze medal winner Paul-Heinz Wellmann recently underwent a tendon operation but—originality lives!—on both Achilles. . .

Corrections on best for British athletes listed in "Where They Are Going" (all '77 marks): Adrian Leek (E Tenn) 14:07.2; Mark Scruton (E Tenn) 1:49.6; Bob Swann (Wn Ky) 14:12.0. . .

Victor Mora was suspended for 6 months by the Colombian Federation for refusing to take a dope test before the Bolivian Games. The ban kept him from competing in the Sao Silvestre run, which he has won 3 times (but Domingo Tibaduiza kept it among the Colombians with his win). . .

Australian Olympic high hurdler Warren Parr (13.6) was reported in an Aussie paper to be headed for Idaho State. . . Top-rated hammer thrower Karl-Hans Riehm underwent his own tendon operation in the fall and expects to start light training any time. . .

IAAF Cross Country champ Leon Schots missed virtually all of the '77 track season with a knee injury he picked up just a week after his big harrier win. The Belgian is back now, though, and is aiming for 13:20 this year. . .

Norway's Grete Waitz finished her '77 season with a brilliant 3000 win in the World Cup, but correspondent Bernt Solaas reports that success didn't settle her mind for the '78 European Championships. "I will train hard in 1978," said Grete, "but not for one race. That would put too much stress on me, like before Montreal. I want more freedom to start when and where I want to." . .

Munich javelin champ (and consequently a West German hero) Klaus Wolfermann is getting geared up again after an operation on his arm. The problem restricted him in '77, but he wants to have a good '78 season, since it will be his last. Of his aborted comeback last year, he said, "I had no aim. I stayed home. This year the obstacle isn't so much the operation, but my professional duties."
