TAKING A BREATHER

Europe's early-season flurry of big meets has passed and we have hit the traditional mid-July deadspot. Well, "dead" may be a bit harsh, but there are few major confrontations, and no major records to report.

Even Henry Rono has dropped out of the headlines, catching his breath before the Commonwealth Games (and the attendant probability of a clash with Brendan Foster).

And many Europeans are playing it cool, gearing up for another big assault in late August when the European Championships roll around.

The biggest news came off the track, with a pair of shattering announcements based in Los Angeles. One was that Los Angeles might relinquish its bid for the 1984 Games, and the other was a decision by the SPAAAU to suspend Dwight Stones, Francie Larrieu, Kate Schmidt and Jane Frederick (some impressive record-holding talent there) for misuse of Superstars money. Dwight has promised a lawsuit.

Next issue of *TN* is in 3 weeks, with fresh results from the Commonwealth Games.
