Official NCAA Dual Ranks

For the first time, collegiate track will have an official poll similar to those used in many other sports. The idea came from coaches who, like *T&FN*, want to bring the collegiate dual meet back to life.

Says North Carolina assistant Dennis Mitchell, organizer of the poll, "The problem with dual meets is there has not been enough real incentive for schools to have them." The poll, says Mitchell, will help the USTCA put the spotlight back on true head-to-head competition in a team sense.

We will be taking an active role in the process. The poll, which will run every week for the duration of the collegiate season (alternating men and women) will start with the next issue of *TN*.

The U.S. Track Coaches Association/*T&FN* Div. I Coaches Dual Rankings Poll, as it will be named, will take the place of our Annual Dual Meet Rankings, which have been a fixture in *T&FN* since 1970.

The results will be generated by a panel of

20 coaches, with the year-end titles (indoors and out) voted on by all the nation's coaches. The voters will make their selections based on a team's performance in scoring meets, plus its "power rating" score. The power rating is a set of scoring tables developed by Idaho State's Dave Nielsen

Cassell vs. Nebiolo?

Canada's track magazine, *Athletics*, predicts an Ollan Cassell vs. Primo Nebiolo battle for the IAAF presidency at the 1995 Congress.

It's a confrontation long rumored in the halls of power, but this is the first time anybody has come out and forecast it so bluntly. Blunt is also writer Cecil Smith's style:

"Nebiolo is an unashamed zealot when it comes to protecting his leadership, therefore anyone who intends to usurp him had better have plenty of courage as well as a healthy wallet. When Nebiolo runs for a particular office, he is like a fire engine going to the wrong fire. His aides in the meantime will have usually swept away all obstacles.

"Although the battle isn't official just yet, you can rest assured that work in the trenches is already underway. Sooner, rather than later, Cassell, if he is going to seriously challenge Nebiolo, will have to announce his candidacy."

Asked about the Ca-

nadian story, USATF head Cassell said, "Presently I have no plans to run for president of the IAAF in 1995."

HJ Classic Canceled

The second edition of the innovative World High Jump Classic has been pulled from the indoor schedule, due primarily to the bugaboo which continues to plague the sport: lack of major-money sponsorship.

Scheduled for February 26 in Chicago,

Bert Nelson, 1921-1993

The track world suffered a great loss as the year began with the death of one of its prime journalistic figures.

Albert D. (Bert) Nelson, co-founder and longtime editor and publisher of *Track & Field News*, died January 9 at age 72. Bert succumbed to the complications of Parkinson's disease after a 6-year struggle with the illness.

In 1948 Bert and brother Cordner established *T&FN*. Bert's vision and guidance determined virtually all of the editorial and operating policies that have kept the magazine flourishing these past 45 years.

Born November 21, 1921, in San Diego, Nelson grew up in California's agricultural breadbasket, the San Joaquin Valley. He was an 880 runner in high school and competed in cross country as a frosh at Cal. After graduation Nelson served as a naval officer in the Pacific in WWII.

After the war he started a small newspaper in San Bruno, California, though his love for track & field soon got the better of him, and in February, 1948, the first issue of *T&FN* appeared. By 1952 this hobby had turned into a full-time enterprise and that also was the year of the company's first Olympic tour—to the Helsinki Olympics.

This division of the magazine, which Nelson instituted, has become very successful and more than 12,000 fans have traveled with TAFNOT over the years to the Olympics, Pan-Am Games, Commonwealth Games, World Track & Field Championships and other sports festivals.

Nelson's column, "Of People and Things," which he wrote for almost 40 years, was one of the magazine's most popular features. A book of the same name, containing many of his best columns, was published in 1975.

In 1991, Bert was inducted into USATF's National Track & Field Hall of Fame, joining his brother Cordner and Jesse Abramson as the only journalists so-honored.

Bert is survived by his wife Jeannette, brother Cordner, daughter Linda Nash, of Richmond, Virginia, and her husband Steve, and three grandchildren.

A full tribute to Bert will appear in the March issue of *T&FN*. He will be missed by all of us.

the single-event competition was done in by one very simple lack, said organizer Brian Vandenburg.

"We needed a true cash sponsor," explained Vandenburg. "We covered the '93 event ourselves, but we needed a sponsor this time to cover expenditures."

A popular competition with the jumpers in its inaugural last year, this year's edition was also going to feature an attempt by Dwight Stones to become the first over-40 jumper to clear the 7-foot barrier.

Vandenburg was gratified to note that many jumpers, as this year's cancellation became inevitable, said they were willing to forego appearance fees and jump for free.

He added that he plans to resume the meet in 1995: "We want to approach potential sponsors now, to educate them about the high jump and how they can benefit from an association with the Classic. We feel it is a very worthy event."

4-Year Penalty Too Long?

Arne Ljunqvist, head of the IAAF's medical commission, has expressed his disfavor with the international governing body's 4-year suspension for steroid violators. The Swede told *L'Équipe* that the IAAF's tough stance is exemplary, but possibly a cause of bad publicity for the sport.

"We expose the cheaters, but many other

sports hardly care," he told the French paper.

"And the training base for most of these sports is the same—strength, speed, the same type of biomechanical movements—and, in the course of training, doping is used. In fact, athletics is probably less affected by doping than a number of other sports because of the systematic testing we do.

"Vis-à-vis civil law, we would be in a better position if the suspension had been kept at 2 years. I said this at the Tokyo Congress [where the bump from 2 to 4 years was first made, in 1991]. With the evidence we have, it is not possible to precisely evaluate the degree of culpability of an individual. Four years of suspension is not acceptable."

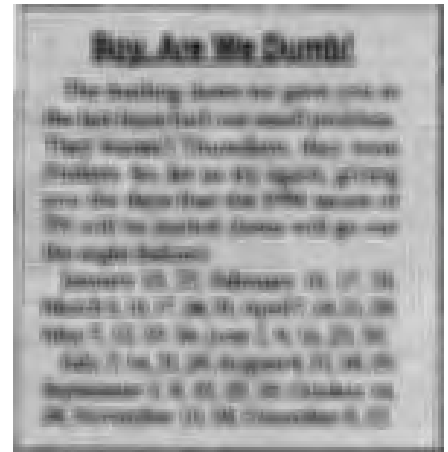
Nonetheless, Ljunqvist is not pushing for any change in the rules, as some federations did at the Stuttgart Congress last summer, explaining, "Reversing ourselves now, so late, would be a show of weakness."

Holes In Drug Testing

Dr. Arnold Beckett, an important figure in the development of drug-testing in sports, has charged that international governing bodies are not doing a good job in nailing cheaters.

Beckett, who resigned from the IOC's medical commission in a dispute related to Clenbuterol (he doesn't feel it should be classed as a steroid, and is against the Krabe & Co. suspensions), expressed his feelings in a January letter to the *London Times*.

"The IOC medical commission is failing



to ensure that its accreditation of laboratories is in accord with international scientific standards of analytical validation and good laboratory practices or ethics," he said.

But his main complaint lay with the fact that athletes aren't being tested for some very effective drugs, specifically citing the IAAF in this department.

"Despite the known serious deficiencies in testing," he said, "IAAF officials pontificate that the record-breaking Chinese athletes cannot be using doping agents because their tests yield negative results.

"Similar statements were made about East German authorities for many years during the time they were scientifically and ruthlessly doping their athletes by using known gaping holes in dope-control procedures."
