A Mile Fan's Dream

How'd you like a chance to dust off your tux and RSVP to this one?

All 15 living breakers of the men's mile World Record have been invited to a dinner in London to celebrate the 40th anniversary of Sir Roger Bannister's legendary first sub-4:00 mile.

The gathering will occur on May 6, the day in 1954 when Bannister ran his historic 3:59.4.

Record setters invited (in chronological order): Arne Andersson and Gunder Hägg (Sweden), Bannister, John Landy (Australia), Derek Ibbotson (Britain), Herb Elliott (Australia), Peter Snell (New Zealand), Michel Jazy (France), Jim Ryun (U.S.), Filbert Bayi (Tanzania), John Walker (New Zealand), and Seb Coe, Steve Ovett and Steve Cram (all Britain), and Algeria's Noureddine Morceli, the current recordman with his 3:44.39 set last summer.

Bannister will be accompanied by Chris Chataway and Chris Brasher, the countrymen who paced him to the record.

Nebiolo For Lighter Ban

In the wake of IAAF medical head Arne Ljunqvist's statement that perhaps the track governing body's 4-year ban on steroid violators is too strong (*T&FN*, March) comes a similar statement from IAAF president Primo Nebiolo.

"The IAAF bans athletes for 4 years. Too long? I would say so and I'm sure that at our 1995 congress in Göteborg we'll discuss a reduction of this sanction," Nebiolo told the Italian paper *Corriere della Sera* in mid-January.

The statement came in the wake a meeting between international sports federations and the IOC, where efforts were made to standardize drug testing and penalties.

No Dating Allowed

Being a world champion carries little weight with coach Ma Junren. The hot-tempered mentor of China's sensational women runners has dismissed Stuttgart 1500 champ Liu Dong, 21, from his team.

Chinese newspapers reported that the prime reason Liu was sacked from the team was that she dated a male sprinter. Ma's athletes are not allowed to date.

Other transgressions listed by the coach included Liu wanting to keep the Mercedes she received as a Stuttgart champion (team rules stipulate that all awards are split evenly with the coach), of "working only for her own glory and not for the good of the team," and even for letting her hair grow (team rules specify a short style).

Ma Wants Bonus Money

Following hot on the heels of reports that Ma Junren had dismissed Liu Dong from his team are stories that he has twice threatened to resign from his job as a provincial coach. He has apparently given authorities until early February to pay what he claimed were bonuses promised his team of star women runners.

But, depending on which newspaper reported the story, Ma also took back a resignation letter and has carried on with coaching his stable of great runners.

Ma has claimed that more than \$150,000 in promised bonuses were not paid to his team. The bonuses were based on the flurry of WRs set by Ma's runners during 1993. The coach claimed the funds would be used primarily for high-altitude training.

Nastiness In Britain

The apparent suicide death of journalist Cliff Temple has rocked British track and field, as claims have surfaced that Andy Norman, the powerful promotions officer for the British Athletic Federation, had spread allegations of sexual harassment against Temple, who also coached women runners.

Temple had authored an article last summer questioning potential conflicts of interest in Norman's position of working for the federation while also acting as an agent for top Britons such as Linford Christie and Colin Jackson.

The *London Times* said there were no indications that Norman had deliberately driven the writer to suicide, but his actions "had the effect of worsening Temple's already fragile mental state and were a contributory cause of his suicide."

BAF chairman Peter Radford said the federation will conduct an investigation of the allegations against Norman. The BAF has asked the *Times* for all its material on the matter, including a tape recording made by Temple of a phone call in which Norman reportedly insinuated he would spread the rumors.

The British Athletics Writers Association has called for Norman's suspension while an independent inquiry is conducted. Norman has refused any comment.
