## Going For World Records

Supermiler Noureddine Morceli says that since there are no major championships this year he's thinking of going on a WR-setting spree, from a 1:41 in the 800 through 12:48 ("Why not?") for 5000m.

Nobody has ever set WRs at those two extremes (or even 1000-5000m), and with PRs of 1:44.85 ('91) and 13:25.20 ('90), Morceli, stud as he is, still has a long way to go. He did drop his kilo PR to a list-leading 2:13.73 last year, though.

The Algerian already has North African company, at least in the prediction department, as Moroccan Khalid Skah has declared 1994 as "the year of World Records for me."

Skah says he's going after the 3000 record indoors and out, and the outdoor 5000 and 10,000 standards. "The times of Aouita and Ondieki don't frighten me," he says.

## Bentley Out Of Rankings

It has taken more than half a year for the news to surface, but USATF has now revealed that long jumper Dion Bentley, originally world ranked No. 9 for 1993, had a positive test for the stimulant pseudo-ephedrine at last June's USATF Championships.

As a result of the test, he was suspended

for 3 months. His appeal was rejected.

Under T&FN's rankings rules, athletes who receive 90-day sitdowns lose credit not only for the meet in which they tested positive, but also for any subsequent meets they might compete in before the suspension takes hold. (By way of comparison, for a steroid suspension we wipe out the athlete's whole calendar year.)

Bentley's credit removals, including his 5th at USATF, have rendered him no longer good enough for a world ranking position. In his stead, Larry Myricks moves up to No. 9, and American Joe Greene enters the Rankings at No. 10.

In the U.S. rankings, Myricks, Greene and Tony Barton all move up a spot (to 4-5-6), with Bentley falling from 4 to 7.

Former national Junior 200 champ **Ricky Carrigan** is on the mend from what was thought to be a career-ending injury. Now competing for Merritt JC, he recently ran 20.5h on a totally reconstructed knee. . .

Seoul marathoner **Mark Conover** has Hodgkin's disease and will undergo 6 months of chemotherapy. . .

**Danny Everett** had a second operation on his right Achilles during December and is not expected to compete this season. . .

A near stress fracture caused **Steve Holman** to miss 16 days of training in December and may limit the '92 Olympian's action indoors. . .

**Carl Lewis** will bypass the indoor season, but manager Joe Douglas says his charge is already in 28-foot jump shape. . .

During the first week of January **Dan O'Brien** cut three fingers on his right hand and required 10 stitches to close the wounds when he slipped on ice and fell outside his home. It was O'Brien's second mishap of the week as earlier he had aggravated an injury to his left foot. . .

After a strong cross country season **Ceci St. Geme** underwent an emergency appendectomy in early January. . .

Former Washington State triple jumper **Joseph Taiwo**, 34, has become a U.S. citizen.
