USATF Indoor Bonuses

The all-time indoor lists will take on added significance at the USATF Championships in Atlanta in March. The national governing body has announced a new program of bonus payments for high-level performances.

The money will be available only to American winners and comes in three levels:

- World Records (only in events on the IAAF's official list) are worth \$25,000.
- Marks making the top 5 performance lists are worth \$10,000.
- Marks making the top 10 are worth \$5000.

Payments will be made only for the highest category earned.

NCAA Convention News

"Gender equity" legislation at the recent NCAA Convention may prove to have a profound effect on college track & field. Delegates overwhelmingly approved (804-1) the recommendations of the Gender-Equity Task Force.

The key element—that schools comply with federal Title IX legislation mandating equal opportunities for the sexes—is not in itself controversial. The battles will rage over interpretation, with some men's coaches pressured to cut back on squad size, squeezed in a numbers game between gender equity and its key opponent, big-time football.

Other developments at the convention:

- Soundly defeated was the plan to allow collegians five years of competition instead of the traditional four.
- A plan to establish travel squad limita-

tions was approved. In cross country, 12 athletes per team can travel to away meets. In indoor track, the number is 33, with 36 allowed for outdoor track.

• Relatives of collegians who compete in the Olympics will be able now to accept donations in order to make the trip without endangering the eligibility of the athlete.

• Provided athletes do not miss class time or school competition, they can now accept expense money to attend clinics and other training programs—a boost to USATF developmental efforts.

• In the off-season, athletes will be able to compete for track clubs—effective this August.

• No more tobacco chewing in practice or competition, rough news for the 22% of male tracksters and 6.9% of females who feel chaw is appealing. Smoking's out, too—for all coaches, athletes and officials.

Out Of Luck On EPO

Although international governing bodies like to trumpet how successful they are becoming in the battle against drugs, the sad truth is that some of the most favored doping methods remain undetectable, and making headway is slow.

The IOC, for example, had hoped to introduce a test for EPO (erythropoietin—a hormone which increases red blood cells) in Lillehammer. But now Prince Alexandre de Merode, the IOC's medical chief, says a reliable test might not even be in place by Atlanta in '96. "The more we test, the more complicated we see it is," de Merode said on

the dawn of the Winter Olympics.

"We don't want to take action too quickly. If we had a case taken to court and were not prepared it would be bad. We prefer to wait."

Blood testing will make its Olympic debut in Lillehammer, as the IOC will be on the watch for blood doping, the practice of re-infusing red cells.

The test can't tell if people are reusing their own blood, but will at least screen out the utilization of other peoples' blood, although that's a practice unlikely to be in vogue in these AIDS-plagued days.

The IAAF has confirmed 4-year drug bans on Austrians Andreas Berger, Thomas Renner, Gernot Kellermayr and Franz Ratzenberger. . .

Former javelin WR holder Steve Backley has recovered from groin and shoulder injuries that hampered his season in '93 and is pleased with his current progress during training. . .

After giving birth to a daughter last September French hurdler Monique Ewanje-Epée is planning a comeback this season. . .

German Heike Henkel, who is due to give birth to her first child in March, is aiming to compete in the European Championships.

"I think I have got a new appetite for high jumping through the baby break," she says. "Last year it was the exact opposite. I wanted to have a baby so much that sport became less interesting." . .

Versatile sprinter Marie-José Pérec has plans to try the 400H this summer. She has a best of 55.76, set in '89. . .

Tokyo 10K gold medalist Liz McColgan had an operation on her knee in November and is now back in training for the '94 season, which will include only one marathon (London) and a concentration on the track season. . .
