IAAF To Revamp WRs?

In a delightful surprise, it appears the IAAF is en route to a two-tiered World Record system, one which will take excess altitude into account in affected events.

It's a move long sought by the world's track & field statisticians (and remember folks, you read that little "A" here first, in 1978), who recognize the destruction high-altitude marks can wreak on WRs and all-time lists.

Worried at what the high-altitude Worlds at Mexico City in '97 might do to the WR lists relative to Sydney 2000, the Australians have been working on a proposal to the IAAF for double records ("Last Lap," July), but the international governing body has apparently taken the jump even without a formal proposal in hand.

The decision to consider the new setup was announced by IAAF president Primo Nebiolo at the World Junior Championships in Portugal. "This new list will reflect the concern that some people have shown," he said.

No details were given as to the specifics of the proposal, but it will have to be passed by the IAAF Council.

The first thing USATF should do is confirm its support for such a plan by adopting a similar resolution at its Convention this fall. And USATF should immediately petition the IAAF to accept Michael Marsh's 19.73 as the real WR in the 200, shunting Pietro Mennea's Mexico 19.72 to the secondary category.

Make no mistake about our wording here. We think the low-altitude marks should be treated as the *real* WRs, with the high-altitude ones getting secondary status, not vice-versa.

Exciting Zürich 5000

Reportedly Algerian superstar Nouredine Morceli has been focusing on an attempt at the 5000 WR, a prospect made all the more thrilling in light of his WR 7:25.11 for 3000 last week.

To that end, he has been doing less racing than usual, and a lot of high-altitude training in Switzerland and France.

The projected site for Morceli's attempt on Haile Gebresilasie's WR of 12:56.96 will be Zürich, on August 17. "If I go to Zürich, it will be to beat the World Record," says Morceli, who has made few forays at the longer distance, and claims a PR of just 13:25.20.

"Remember that I ran the 3000 in 7:29.24 last year, so there will be no problem in passing through the 3000 in 7:44-7:45 [Gebresilasie ran 7:50.9]. And I can do the last kilometer in 2:30 [the Ethiopian ran 2:28.7]. You'll see."

One thing's for sure: Morceli won't be ducking anybody in the Weltklasse race, as "all" the big-name Kenyans and Moroccans are also supposed to be in the race, plus hot American Bob Kennedy, whose reaction to facing such heavy company is confident.

"I think I'm going to lay it on the line," he says. "I've run 13:02; I'm fit. I've made the breakthrough into being one of the best in the world. I might as well see what I can do."

New Court For Athletes

Even if Butch Reynolds' lawsuit against the IAAF appears to be down for the count, it has provided motivation to the sporting world's top leaders to put together a new system for handling doping disputes.

The International Council of Arbitration has now been set up, the result of a protocol signed by 31 of the world's sport federations. Pushed by the IOC and the Association of Summer Olympic International Federations, the accord sets up a panel to be based in Lausanne, Switzerland.

The panel will consist of 20 international jurists, who will appoint a list of 100 arbitrators to hear cases. The council will control the Court of Arbitration for Sport, which will be independent of the IOC. The court will have two divisions, one for arbitration and another for appeals.

Primo Nebiolo says the IAAF plans to change its constitution to require track athletes to go through the IAAF appeals process before going to the arbitration council.

Athletes will probably be asked to sign an agreement pledging to resolve disputes by this means rather than by litigation.

IAAF Warns Athletes

In the aftermath of the controversy that saw three British athletes skip the Stockholm GP while the meet director called for their suspension, the IAAF has indicated that it will not be so lenient with athletes in the future.

The IAAF's Valerie Servageon said, "Written contracts between promoters and athletes are being strongly recommended by the IAAF with a view to making these con-

tracts compulsory in the near future."

Servageon noted that the three British athletes in question received their warnings from the IAAF not for pulling out of Stockholm, but for their subsequent competition inside the prohibited period.

She cited the IAAF's Code of Conduct, which says, "If an athlete withdraws from a competition due to illness or injury, the athlete shall be subject to a compulsory recuperation period of seven days from the date of that competition. During the course of this period, the athlete may not compete at all.

"Athletes competing within the recuperation period will be regarded as not having been injured or ill at the time of the relevant competition and will be subject to penalties in accordance with these regulations."
