Courts Don't Necessarily Agree On Drug Bans

As we saw in the protracted Butch Reynolds case, civil courts don't always agree with the IAAF and national-governing bodies when it comes to what's up in the drug-testing world, as recent developments in three nations show:

United States: Noon Beats USATF

Shot putter Brent Noon, who earlier settled out of court with UCLA, has won a huge damage suit against USATF. A San Diego jury awarded Noon \$983,000 in the case, which involved USATF (then TAC) random-testing procedures.

USATF suspended Noon for five weeks in early '92 when he failed to respond to notices for testing. Noon claimed he didn't respond because he had moved across the country. Noon was seeking recompense because he said the ban affected his Olympic Trials preparation, and he subsequently didn't make the Barcelona squad, finishing 9th.

USATF lawyers said the judgment will be reduced to \$740,000, but the group will nonetheless be appealing the decision.

Russia: Narozhilenko Wins Round

A Moscow court has ruled that hurdler Lyudmila Narozhilenko, who received a 4-year IAAF ban after testing positive for steroids in February of '93, is innocent of wrongdoing and should be free to compete.

Narozhilenko's husband later said that he had put the drugs in her food as part of a domestic dispute, but IAAF rules are clear that it doesn't matter how you ingested banned substances, but whether you did or not.

"We were shocked by this decision," said Vladimir Usachev, president of the Russian federation. "The prosecutor didn't ask us a single question in three days and then delivered an emotional speech saying that Narozhilenko had lost her job and was left with her 11-year-old daughter."

There will be an appeal to a higher court, said Usachev, but the federation will ignore the current decision and keep Narozhilenko on the sidelines: "We are abiding by the

rules of dope tests adopted by the international federation."

For her part, the 30-year-old Narozhilenko said, "I wouldn't go through this torturing court procedure if I wasn't 100% sure I was right. Even if I don't go to the 1995 World Championships or to the 1996 Olympics I will keep running after the disqualification is over."

Germany: Krabbe Files Suit

Banned German sprinter Katrin Krabbe has filed a million mark (\$640,000) suit against the IAAF and DLV (German federation). Krabbe is claiming damages over her 2-year (reduced from a 4-year) suspension from the sport.

The '91 world champ over 100 and 200m, Krabbe believes a civil court will rule that two years is an excessive time to keep someone from carrying out a profession. She thinks the German court will decide that the IAAF was acting outside its province.

Miler Attacks Ma

Ma Junren carries powers which extend beyond "Ma's Army" says defending world champion miler Liu Dong, who was thrown off the squad earlier this year in a clash with the dogmatic coach.

"Ma Junren has excluded me from his team," Liu told a Beijing newspaper. "But he doesn't want me to pursue my career in

another province. I'm in good health, and if I resume my training I could beat the World Record.

"Several teams have claimed me, but Ma refuses to send me all the official papers necessary to sign up elsewhere."

Whitfield Joins USATF

Former national-class hurdler Ashland Whitfield has joined USATF's Indianapolis staff as Manager For Teams & Athlete Services. Whitfield, 42, succeeds Duffy Mahoney, who earlier this year took over as the federation's Chief of Operations.

A '73 Arizona grad, Whitfield set his PR of 13.75 in '76, a year in which he finished 6th in his semi at the Olympic Trials. He duplicated that placing in the '80 Trials.

While serving in the U.S. Army, Whitfield twice won the world military (CISM) title. He was an assistant coach at Army '82-'85 and in '90 became an assistant at Yale.
