THE ROAD TO ATLANTA STARTS HERE. It's a World Championships year, and the jockeying for Atlanta positions begins in earnest. The international season will reach its highest peak, of course, with the Worlds in Göteborg in August, but there are a lot of exciting things to come before that.

Perhaps as exciting as anything is the potential of USATF's new indoor TV Circuit, which will kick off with the Millrose Games on February 3.

Whatever happens in 1995, you may rest assured that *Track Newsletter* will be there to bring you all the facts as quickly as they happen. We're glad to have you all aboard, and hope you enjoy the campaign as much as we're going to.

Important IAAF Activity

Recent IAAF actions not covered in the report in the February issue of *T&FN*:

- The deadline for bids for the 1999 World Championships has been set at November 15 of this year. Seville, Spain, is the only bidder to date (and is said to be ready to step in should Mexico City's bid—amid rumors of its shakiness—fall through).

- The number of track athletes competing in Atlanta will be down significantly from previous Olympics. The cuts, however, will be among lesser athletes, as they will be achieved by going to the two-tiered A-B qualifying system already in use for the World Championships.

This step (a voluntary one by the IAAF) should forestall any move by the IOC to cut track back to 2 entries per event as it continues to find ways to put a cap on Olympic participants.

- The roster of member nations increased

to 206 with the reinstatement of Cambodia and restoration of full rights to Yugoslavia. Norfolk Island has been granted provisional affiliation, pending a vote of the Congress (Göteborg in August).

- Delegates representing 22 Spanish- and Portuguese-speaking nations at the Ibero-American Games voted unanimously to support Primo Nebiolo's candidature for presidency at this year's elections.

- Nebiolo has named 1995 "The Year Of Athletics."

- Several championship dates for 1996 were clarified: World Cross Country, March 23 (Cape Town, South Africa); World Road Relay, April 13-14 (Copenhagen, Denmark); World Junior, August 21-25 (Sydney, Australia); World Half-Marathon, October 6 (Palma de Mallorca, Spain).

- The GP Commission is considering adding Sydney, Tokyo and Johannesburg to the roster of '96 GP meets.

- The men's 20K road race has been dropped from the World Junior Champs because of a previous lack of participants.

Two Drug Cases Deferred

At the same time it was upholding the ban on Kenyan John Ngugi (*T&FN*, February), the IAAF's arbitration panel held over for further review the positive-steroid-test cases of Nigerian hurdler Ime Akpan and Dutch thrower Erik de Bruin.

In de Bruin's case, the Dutch federation asked for a postponement in his hearing, which will now probably be held in February.

Akpan, supported by the Nigerian federation, is arguing that a contraceptive pill she was taking led to her positive test. The

arbitration panel ruled there was "insufficient evidence to disprove this theory beyond reasonable doubt." It asked for medical information and will reconvene by early March.

Major Schedule Changes

Changes to the big-meet schedules printed in the October 26 edition of the newsletter:

Grand Prix I

São Paulo confirmed as May 14; Cologne moves from August 27 to August 18; Berlin moves from September 5 to September 1.

Grand Prix II

Melbourne is not GP II, is International Invitational; Rieti moves from August 22 to September 5.

Indoor Meets

Montréal (January 15) has been canceled; add Maebashi, Japan (February 5).

Cross Country

San Sebastián moves from January 30 to January 29.

Burrell Compares WRs

Leroy Burrell has run in the last three World Record 100s—and claimed the top honor itself in two of them.

Burrell sped 9.90 at the '91 nationals and 9.85 last July in Lausanne. Between those records, he clocked 9.88 for 2nd to Carl Lewis's 9.86 in the Tokyo Worlds final in '91.

Can Burrell compare those races? He says, "They're pretty different, actually. In the 9.90 in New York, I got a great start. I'd been doing that all during '91.

"But I think it became my undoing in Tokyo, when I didn't get the best start of anyone in the field. I think I panicked a little and pushed too hard in the middle.

"I really, really went after it in Tokyo—but it really showed at the end, because I died like a dog. Actually, I died in New York too, but I was farther in front of everyone.

"I think getting those great starts I once did kind of took me out of my race. I went from being a lousy starter/great middle guy/great finisher, to great starter/OK middle/subpar finisher.

"But I've come full circle now, which is how I ran in Lausanne: now I'm an OK starter, I accelerate strongly in the middle, then finish well. Those are my strengths and

I think it's the best way to run a 100. "I've done it all ways and I definitely think it's easier to do it like I am now."

Hood Malady Overblown

If you believed the story on the Internet late last fall, star Arkansas miler Graham Hood had a life-threatening medical complication, saw a mysterious light and vowed never to run again until he had read the entire Bible.

Arkansas coach John McDonnell says the situation was "blown way out of proportion, mainly through e-mail notes."

McDonnell clarifies that his Canadian star had a cold and took some antibiotics on an empty stomach. Then, after a 12M run later that day, he broke out in hives and his eyes were swollen.

"Five minutes into the trip back, he was looking really bad," McDonnell says. "So I put my foot to the floor and got him to the campus infirmary. His eyes were real puffy and he said everything was white, like looking into the sun. They gave him a shot and about an hour later he was fine. He has been OK since."

Coogan The Marathoner

Mark Coogan just keeps running longer and longer. In '89 and '90 he was the nation's No. 4-ranked steeplechaser. In '92 he was No. 6 in the 5000 and No. 9 in the 10,000 and in '93 No. 8 in the 10.

In '94 he tried the marathon for the first time, and a 2:13:24 debut at the Boston Marathon has him thinking perhaps he's a 26-miler. The 28-year-old Maryland alum says he'll know for sure after the Pan-Am Marathon, for which he has been chosen.

"This is going to be my big test," he told the Denver Post. "It could be hot and humid down there. If it's real tough on me, I'll drop down to shorter distances; I don't want to jeopardize my career. But I really hope marathons fit me."

He reasoned that since many runners don't take up the marathon until their 30s, he has a bit of an advantage. "I'm hoping, at my age, I have more potential to improve," he said. "If I hit it big in the marathon I'm going to stick with it. I'll know more after Argentina."

Road Qualifying Set

Selection procedures for all major 1995 U.S. road teams, including those for the fifth edition of the outdoor World Championships, have been announced by USATF.

Marathon

World Champs. Three men and three women will be selected on the basis of times

run between January 1, 1994, and April 17, 1995. To be eligible, men must have run 2:16:00 or faster and women 2:35:00 or faster during the qualifying period.

World Cup Marathon. Five-member teams will represent the U.S. in both the men's and women's races. Fall '94 marathon performances will be the primary criterion in choosing men's team members. Prospective members of the women's team must have run under 2:40:00 between June 18 and December 11 of 1994.

Pan-Am Games. Mark Coogan and Jerry Lawson have been selected for the men's team. The women, whose selection is still open, must have run faster than 2:40:00 between June 18, 1994, and January 11, 1995.

Walks

World Champs and World Cup 50K. The top 5 at the U.S. 50K Championships (see p. 4) qualified for the World Cup 50, and the first 3 (if qualified) will comprise the World Champs squad.

World Cup 20K. The top 5 finishers at a race to be held in Monterey, California, on February 19.

World Cup 10K. The first 5 women in a trial to be held at Walt Disney World's Epcot Center near Orlando, Florida, on January 28.

World Champs 20K & 10K. Top 3 at the USATF Championships in June.
