## Nebiolo OKs Money

No matter how many big-name athletes said they skipped the World Indoor because it "interfered with training schedules," or because they were "tired after a long indoor season," the fact is that the studs didn't come for one reason and one alone: no pay.

One still has to suspect that some athletes are also going to rumble mightily about competing in Göteborg this summer sans prize money.

With the dissatisfaction being so evident in Barcelona, IAAF head Primo Nebiolo said, "After Atlanta I believe we have to study and to examine the possibility of having indemnity expenses in our five great events."

By "five great events," he meant—logically enough—the pairs of indoor and outdoor Worlds that come in each Olympic quadrennium, and—not so logically—the World Cup.

"We will discuss this possibility with the IOC," said Nebiolo. "If the IOC refuses to discuss this problem the problem will be faced by us alone."

## No Money At Olympics

In Argentina for the start of the Pan-Am Games, IOC head Juan Antonio Samaranch said he has no opposition to the IAAF's awarding prize money to athletes. "It is up to them; it is not my problem," he said.

"I spoke with Nebiolo some days ago in Barcelona and he told me they are studying and discussing the possibility. But he told me very clearly that he never mentioned the Olympic Games." Samaranch cautioned, "Never at the Olympics. I think the Olympic Games is different."

You don't suppose Fermin Cacho's brother is a Spanish border guard do you? Vénuste Niyongabo showed up for the World Champs without a visa for Spain. Immigration officials grilled him for three hours before he decided to fly back to his training base in Italy. Never did come back.

## Final Indoor Dual Poll

Voting at the NCAA Indoor Championships, Division I coaches crowned Nebraska and North Carolina the best indoor dual meet teams of the season. For the Nebraska men it was a close one, with 16 first-place votes to Arkansas's 14. The decision yielded a second straight indoor title for the Huskers.

The North Carolina women had to weather no such scare, earning 20 first-place votes; no other team got more than 2. The Tar Heels handily unseated defending champ Nebraska. To be eligible for the ranking, a team must have competed in at least one indoor scoring dual against a Div. I opponent.
