Walk-Ons Need Not Apply

Gender equity is a mixed blessing for some programs, notes one Div. I coach who understandably asks to remain anonymous. Recently the coach's women's program got a big boost at the expense of the men's. While the opportunities for women are now enhanced, the coach is actually under a mandate to turn away male walk-ons to his state university team because they could skew the male/female balance.

"How do you tell an in-state man who's parents pay taxes that he could probably contribute to the team, but he's not allowed to join?" asks the coach.

"When I see a young man who can't compete, I tell him, 'Take it to court.' The situation is ripe for a lawsuit."

Cross Challenge Kicks In

The World Cross Country Championships brought the IAAF Cross Challenge to a double come-from-behind conclusion. Ismael Kirui and Catherina McKiernan each moved up from the No. 2 spot to take the series title in the end.

McKiernan's 2nd-place finish in the Durham race brought her points total to 135 ahead of Rose Cheruiyot's 126, earning the Irishwoman the Cross Challenge title for the third year in a row.

World 5000 champ Kirui finished with 135 points, as well, after he also took 2nd at the Championships. Kirui placed 3rd in the 1994 Cross Challenge behind two men who went on to set World Records last summer, Haile Gebrsilasie and William Sigei.

Names In The News

The Boston Marathon has some dynamite fields lined up. Women's headliners include defending champ Uta Pippig, New York defender Tegla Loroupe, Barcelona champ Valentina Yegorova and Olympic 10K

silver medalist Elana Meyer.

On the men's side, two-time defending champ Cosmas Ndeti tops the list of entrants. He'll be joined by countryman Benson Masya, Lameck Aguta, Sammy Nyangincha and Moses Tanui. The Kenyans will have to contend with WC silver medalist Lucketz Swartbooi and two-time Chicago winner Luis dos Santos, among others. . .

Oregon, which will host the '96 NCAA Championships, will have its track resurfaced late this summer. The Ducks would apparently like to host the meet again in 2000, and Eugene is also interested in hosting the '99 USATF Champs, which would be the World Champs qualifier for that year. . .

New Eugene distance-running residents include Marc Davis, Clare Eichner, Michelle DiMuro and Steve Ave. . .

The Detroit Marathon (more specifically, the *Detroit Free Press/Mazda* Marathon, to be staged October 15) has taken on marketing giant IMG as marketing and management coordinator. . .

The Penn Relays will have major corporate support for the next three years, with Midatlantic Bank providing close to a half-million dollars. This helps offset the shortfall caused by the withdrawal of Bill Cosby's support last year. . .

The hammer, relegated as it so often is to obscure fields outside the main stadium, is frequently referred to as an orphan event. SMU's Brian Murer clarified that for the Associated Press, calling it, "The redheaded stepchild of a redheaded stepchild." Murer also said the weight was even less glamorous, noting, "I don't think anyone enjoys throwing the weight because it's so heavy." . .

Southwestern Louisiana's Edgar Garcia sprained his plant foot after jumping 7-3^{3/4} in his first meet of the season. The Puerto Rican senior, who PRed with his 7-4^{1/2} at last year's NCAA meet, is expected to come around soon, now that he is having decent workouts again.

Ragin' Cajun coaches will, however, be redshirting hurdler Winston Sinclair (49.77) and sprinter Keisha Owens (23.40).

Lewis Sales is a hurdler to watch, says

George Mason's John Cook. Sales, a senior this year, is working with volunteer coach Renaldo Nehemiah.

"He just missed qualifying last year, but he ran a 50.88," says Cook. "I think he'll make it this year. He'll be good."

A slight ham strain kept NC State sprinter Alvis Whitted (10.13) out of the indoor season. Outdoors he's running the 400. "Obviously we'd like to short sprint him," says Rollie Geiger, "but he has to heal first."

Long jumper Neil Chance (26-3^{1/2}) is also bothered by a hamstring injured in January. "We're also running him as a long sprinter now. It's a healing process."

With Mario Sategna already over 8000 in the early season, it's looking as if the Knoxville decathlon could be a hot one. Not to be forgotten is Weber State's Bill Schuffenhaur. A dnf last year, the 7570 performer is in great shape, reports coach Chuck Hislop.

"If we can keep him healthy and get him over the pole vault, I think he'll be over 8000 for sure this year."

It's fair to say that Texas frosh Sammy Unberhagen came out of nowhere during the indoor season. "That's how it seemed to us, too," says Longhorn head Stan Huntsman. After running 9:13.63 for 3200 as a Texas prep, Unberhagen redshirted his first year at Austin.

In his first mile this year, Unberhagen and UTEP's Jim Svenøy jogged through a 2:15 first half before racing to the wire in 1:59. Eventually he ran 4:01.36 to make the NCAA final.

"He told me he was going to make that final," says Huntsman. "He raced like a veteran in the heats. He ran out of gas in the final [10th], but that was probably as much emotional letdown as anything. He had achieved his goal."

The Humor Corner
