Squad Flies To Reynolds

Despite his long history of involvement with the IAAF, Butch Reynolds was apparently unaware that the international governing body sends "flying squads" around the world to perform surprise drug tests. It was one of these visits that led Kenya's John Ngugi to his back-and-forth battle with the IAAF.

Reynolds was stunned on July 13 when a pair of IAAF reps showed up at his house and asked for a urine sample. He said the visit, which came when he had guests, "disturbed the whole chemistry of my household."

Since he has always claimed that his earlier positive IAAF test may have been the result of a switched sample, Reynolds went to a local hospital and also had a sample taken there as a backup.

Reynolds made no mention of a lawsuit this time out, but did tell the Associated Press he wanted a figure no less than President Clinton to know what was going on.

"I've been tested on 48- or 24-hour notice, but this is the first time someone has just knocked on my door and asked for a test without warning," he said. "That shouldn't happen in this country."

Problems For Brit Stars

The British Championships (see p. 214) were as notable for off-track action as on. Three of the nation's biggest stars made headlines:

Linford Christie—Citing a sore tendon behind his right knee, he finished a non-qualifying 4th in his heat, and was given "guest" status in the final, which he won in 10.18. "I'm running in pain," he said. "It's taking too long to clear up and I'm beginning to panic."

Sally Gunnell—The 400H WR holder removed herself from consideration in her prime event because of a lingering Achilles problem. "I've decided I can't get into shape to retain the title," she said. She does, however, want a position on the British 4x4, which she anchored to bronze in Stuttgart.

Colin Jackson—He ran the heats, then skipped the semis, saying he had an injured groin. In a miraculous recovery, he ran 13.32 to beat Florian Schwarthoff in Italy some 24 hours later.

Jackson had earlier said he might skip the Worlds because of an ongoing undefined illness. A recent test indicated the presence of a virus that is linked to mono and hepatitis.

"It seems clear that the federation will have to review its rules and selection policy for major championships," said BAF head Peter Radford, coming down hard on the selection committee for naming Jackson to the team. "I do not believe these decisions are correct."

Selection chair David Cropper said, "We certainly can't endorse Colin's action, but it is not for the selectors to consider any disciplinary action."

The committee did put Jackson's Göteborg participation in jeopardy, however, when they added a "must-show-fitness" rider to his team membership. But Jackson said, "I have decided to withdraw from further competitions before the World Championships in order to concentrate fully on preparing to defend my title."

"I must be the one to decide where I race and not have to answer to too many people along the way."

Names In The News...

Michael Johnson has—for now at least—run into a brick wall in his attempts to get the Atlanta 200/400 schedule modified more completely. IOC head Juan Antonio Samaranch told him it was up to the IAAF, and in mid-July IAAF general secretary István Gyulai said the federation had done all it could. "It is up to him if he wants to take advantage of it or not..."

The IAAF had better news for banned British halfmiler **Diane Modahl**. She'll be the beneficiary of an unprecedented third test of the urine sample which twice before has shown an unacceptable testosterone/epitestosterone ratio...

Don't worry that **Dennis Mitchell** isn't turning in the same rash of sub-10 clockings he was at this time last year, says coach John Smith. "The objective was totally different then," Smith told *L'Equipe*. "His only goal now is to be first, Sunday, August 6, 7:00, at the finish of the 100m in the World Championships. The rest is unimportant..."

Add to the Kenya-Ethiopia rivalry: 5000 WR setter **Moses Kiptanui** says he took that mark away from Haile Gebrselassie because the Ethiopian had taken the 10K mark from Kenyan **William Sigei**.

"The 10,000m is a Kenyan race; I was not going to stand anybody from another country encroaching on our zone," he said...

Just in case anybody thought that **Steve Cram** might still have a comeback in the woodwork, he recently noted, "I'm 34 and I had leg surgery last year. My career is finished. I'll just run a few road races for pleasure..."

According to **Ron Reid** of the *Philadelphia Inquirer*, among the slights USATF inflicted on **Mobil**, causing the oil giant not to renew its domestic contract, was the moving of the USATF Indoor from New York City to Atlanta. Georgia doesn't have any Mobil stations...

Former high hurdler **Laurent Ottoz** has been making big strides in his conversion to the longer event. In only his ninth race at this distance, he ran an Italian Record 48.53 at Lausanne.

Fifteen-months-younger brother **Patrick** has run 49.44. The pair are the sons of **Eddy Ottoz**, bronze medalist in the 110H at Mexico City in '69.

Status Quo

Gail Devers' route to defending her WC hurdle title just got a little tougher. Last year's No. 1, **Svetla Dimitrova** of Bulgaria, had been rumored to be feuding with her federation and living in Austria. Now comes word that she's back home training and is planning a late-July return to competition...

Also scheduled not to compete until later this month is Russian sprinter **Irina Privalova**, but she made that known months ago...

Russian triple jumper **Leonid Voloshin** hasn't competed since the '94 indoor season, when he set an undercover WR of 58-3/4. He has undergone a second Achilles surgery and is unlikely to compete at all this year...

Jamaican dash star **Merlene Ottey** has split from her coach/boyfriend, former Italian sprinter **Stefano Tilli**.
