NBC Buys Sydney TV Rights

In a surprise move—at least to the other networks—NBC has purchased the U.S. television rights for the 2000 Olympics and the 2002 Winter games in a flurry of behind-the-scenes dealings with IOC officials.

The rights cost NBC a whopping record \$1.27 billion, \$705 million for Sydney, and the remaining amount earmarked for the Winter Games. "It was a very important offer," said IOC president Juan Antonio Samaranch. "We said 'yes' immediately."

As to speculation that the big contract represented an unbeatable high, Samaranch countered, "We always say that we've reached the peak and that it will go down, but it's not true. Sport and the Olympics are growing and growing and becoming more important. I'm not sure it will go down."

NBC paid \$465 million for the Atlanta Games.

Track's Share Too Small?

With a record \$705 million coming from NBC for the U.S. TV rights to the 2000 Games—and approximately \$900 million due for the 1996 global TV rights—a conflict is brewing over how much of the cash the IAAF is entitled to.

IOC head Juan Antonio Samaranch said that between \$25 and \$27 million will go to the federations participating in Atlanta. He indicated that track will likely get the biggest share.

The proposal falls far short of the \$100 million the IAAF is demanding. While the IOC will propose a distribution of the revenues, the final decision will be made by the Association of International Summer Olympic Federations (ASOIF), which track chief Primo Nebiolo also heads.

In 1989, ironically, Nebiolo proposed that every summer federation receive an equal share. As a result, the IAAF received only \$1.5 million from the Barcelona TV funds. Prior to that, the IAAF had received a straight 20% of TV revenues.

Said Samaranch of the ASOIF's role, "We cannot intervene. But we are prepared to give the federations a second amount as compensation. We consider track & field will be in a special category, receiving 20%."

They Said It

A last look at the World Championships, through the eyes of the athletes:

Mike Powell: "I knew it would be a tough competition. It's been a tough year for me. I can't say I'm happy. I'm in the middle of a bad year and I had a bad meet today. I don't like getting my butt kicked every week, so I'll remember this when I'm training for Atlanta next year."...

Carl Lewis: "I expect to have a great season next year. No question, a season like this will motivate me better than running well this year would have. I'm going to have a season that surprises people."...

Darnell Hall: "I'm going to tell them to put more money in the 200 so he (Johnson) will stay in the 200."...

Brent Noon: "I was hopeful. Yesterday was the first day to throw hard since my injury (ribs on right side in training fall three weeks ago). I struggled yesterday, but didn't hurt myself any more. It's hard coming into a competition like this babying an injury."...

Wilson Kipketer: "I am Danish. Just look at my red and white tracksuit. I feel Danish, I like Denmark, everything about it—and the beer is good."

"Unlike all the other Kenyan children, I didn't have to run to school and back because the farmhouse was next to the school. I could walk there nice and slowly."...

Moses Kiptanui: "I think the IAAF should think very carefully about this. We should have the chance to double. I am in great shape and would love to have run the steeplechase and the 5000 here but it is too late for that now."

"It is probably too late to do that at Atlanta next year. I have already seen the schedule and it would be very difficult. It is OK for the sprinters, but we should get a fair chance too."...

Pauline Davis on what has helped athletes from Caribbean countries: "Our eating is conducive. We eat a lot of earth foods; we don't eat a lot of fat foods. We don't have ham and bacon in the morning. As a child, that was a delicacy for me, ham, bacon and eggs. My mother fed me banana porridge."...

Kim Batten: "I've been trying so hard to gain respect. No one has really given it to me. Even going into this meet, I was not really considered the favorite. It really made me mad. I said I was going to show everybody. I didn't know I was going to break the World Record. But I was going to show people that I am a good hurdler."...

Jonathan Edwards: "My jump phase was massive here, but I was probably half a meter down on the hop and step. A jump of 18.50 [60-8^{1/2}] is perfectly feasible. Seventeen meters [55-9^{1/4}] used to be the benchmark for the event. Now new horizons are being opened up."

On his recent achievements: "It's almost surreal. So many great athletes have tried for a World Record and failed. Then comes along this skinny, ordinary looking guy with no aura about him and decimates it. If I never come within a half meter again, I will have no complaints."

Will success affect him? "I'm not going to start wearing fluorescent tights."...

Tony Jazett, on his early influences in hurdling: "My coach told me to go back and watch the greats. One of the great things I used to do was watch videos of Nehemiah and Roger Kingdom. Nehemiah was just graceful, and Kingdom was just 'the Beast.' That's how I looked at it: you've got to go out there and be aggressive. And I looked at Nehemiah as a classic hurdler."

"I tried to carry out that idea of being of aggressive, so I'd hit hurdles and still carry on."

"My recommendation is that you put trust in your coach and watch your tapes. There are some great athletes out there, and you've got to know them."

On winning his seventh straight bronze or silver at a major meet: "I'm going to be the Merlene Ottey of men's track & field."...

Derrick Adkins, who has no need to call a psychic hotline to see into the future, since his mother, Carole, reads the stars and forecasts future events for him: "She reads the stars and tells me when I will run well. She just reads books and the newspapers, and applies what she reads. She never tells me anything negative."

"Last summer, my mother told me I would have big expectations. I had been ranked ninth in the world in 1992 and seventh in '93. Last year, I became No. 2. But she said that if anyone would beat me, it would be another Cancer. Sam (Matete) is a Cancer."

"Last May she said that August would be a big month for me."
