— 1995 High School AOYs —

Men

With 400 rival Obea Moore and miler Michael Stember nipping at his heels, Jerome Young's long sprint exploits pushed the Prince Tech of Hartford senior over the top in the men's balloting for T&FN's 1995 High School Athlete Of The Year.

Young garnered just 3 of 20 No. 1 votes but took 13 No. 2s to triumph anyway. Moore and Stember each got 7 No. 1 votes, with javelin thrower Troy Burkholder receiving 2 and 800 specialist Michael Granville 1.

Highlighting the season for the Jamaican-born Young, who became a U.S. citizen in the spring, was his USATF Junior Championships win over Moore. His 45.01 clocking in that race on the heels of a Golden West loss to Moore made Young the No. 2 prep all-time.

"For years I've been thinking about running 45," Young says. "That's what I wanted and it happened."

At first his breakthrough shocked Young into fearing he might never run so fast again. "Is it over for me?" he thought. "Is it the last time I'll run that fast?" Subsequent 45.71 and 45.74 races—the latter in placing 2nd to Moore in the Pan-Am Junior Champs—have convinced Young his limits lie ahead.

For his frosh collegiate year, at least, Young is headed for Wallace State, an Alabama JC.

Women

On the women's side, hurdler Joanna Hayes (North, Riverside, Ca) won out as AOY. She earned 13 of 18 No. 1 votes and was an easy winner. Of the five dissenting voters, three

saw sprinter Angela Williams as No. 1 and two tabbed distance runner Julia Stamps.

Hayes' straightaway hurdles campaign was an unbroken skein, as she won Golden West, National Scholastic, USATF Junior and Pan-Am Junior titles, and popped eye-opening 13.38/13.06w marks.

As a long hurdler, she won at California State and Golden West and clocked 40.81 and 59.02. Her only loss came over a full lap at the USATF Juniors to super frosh Char Foster.

Making these achievements all the more propitious is the fact the UCLA-bound Hayes only began hurdling in the spring of '94 after beginning her high school career as a horizontal jumper.

"What was lying there dormant, I just woke up a little bit," says Charles Leathers, the coach who introduced Hayes to hurdling. "It was something she took to very, very naturally. I've been in this mess for over 20 years and by far she is the most gifted and talented that I've seen in what she accomplished in such a short period of time."

More Women on IOC

The International Olympic Committee wants to open the door for a greater rule-making role by women.

The IOC's Executive Board announced in late September it wants women to hold at least 10% of decision-making positions within five years, and 20% within 10 years.

The Board instructed the world's 197 Olympic committees to meet the 10% figure by December 31, 2000, and the 20% number by the end of 2005.

While IOC Director General François

Carrard acknowledged that the time goals may be more difficult to reach in certain cultures, he said, "From the standpoint of principle and idealism, 10% looks like a very low percentage.

"Yet you have to be realistic. You can't achieve this worldwide in a short term. You can't just snap your fingers and resolve problems that haven't been solved for 2000 years."

American Anita DeFrantz, the only woman on the Executive Board, said, "I'm delighted. It gives us many opportunities to expand the reach of sport by including women. It's an important beginning."

The proposal will be submitted to the full IOC for approval when the body meets next July, before the start of the Atlanta Games.

Fastest Rabbit-less Miles?
