## Oregon Runners Prevail

Modesto, Calif., May 26 -- Oregon's talented Ducks, although suffering a couple of disappointments, showed why they are the favorite for the NCAA team title with a number of outstanding performances at the California Relays.

The Ducks suffered their first disappointment in the high hurdles when Jerry Tarr hit a hurdle midway through the race and failed to place as veteran Hayes Jones won handily in 13.5. Tarr, who has run 13.3 this season, clocked 13.6 in his heat and appeared ready for Jones in the final. Jones got his usually fast start but Tarr caught him halfway to the tape. Then Tarr hit the hurdle. Oregon was shooting for the world record in the two-mile relay but had to settle for a national collegiate mark of 7:20.2 as second man Ted Abram could run only 1:52.2.

Outside of those two things, however, everything else went for Oregon. A Duck quartet of Mel Renfro, Mike Gaechter, Tarr and Jerome surprised some crack teams in the 440 relay with a 40.0 performance, which ties the best ever run around two turns. The Striders were second in 40.1 with Texas Southern third. Earlier, Jerome figured in a disputed finish in the 100 when he handed Bob Hayes of Florida A&M his first defeat in two years. Both crossed the finish together and the judges picked Jerome as the winner. However, newsmen and others on the finish thought Hayes won. Hayes had clocked 9.3 in his heat and he repeated the time in the final although running with a 101 degree fever.

Another standout for Oregon was junior Keith Forman, who ran a last 440 of 56.7 to win the mile in 3:58.3, his best and the second Oregon runner to break four minutes this season. Cary Weisiger, improving every week, was second in 3:59.3, also his first sub-four minute effort. Although finishing second, Vic Reeve of the Ducks looked good in the two miles with his 8:47.1 clocking. Bruce Kidd was an easy winner in 8:41.9 after running his last 880 in 2:02. The Webfoots also scored another second when Les Tipton threw the javelin 237'4 1/2".

The Santa Clara Valley Youth Village accounted for an American and a world best with a 3:15.5 in the sprint medley relay as Oregon State finished second in a national collegiate record 3:17.7. Details of this race are reported in the June issue of Track & Field News.

## Villanova Wins IC4A Title

Villanova, Pa., May 26 -- Although they didn't really need them, the Villanova Wildcats received fine doubles from sprinter Frank Budd and middle distance runner Pat Traynor while rolling up 49 1/2 points at the IC4A Championships. It was an easy victory for Coach Jim Elliott's team as runnerup Yale could score only

25½ points.

Budd, running against a slight headwind, beat teammate Paul Drayton on two occasions to win the 100 and 220 finals in 9.6 and 20.6, respectively. At the Friday trials, Budd had clocked 9.5 and 20.6. Traynor, a junior, attempted a difficult mile-steeplechase double and came very close to winning both races. In the mile, Traynor set the pace for the first three laps in 59.1, 2:02.5 and 3:06.1. At the beginning of the gun lap Boston College's Larry Rawson challenged for the lead and then went past Traynor on the backstretch. Also going by on the backstretch was Harvard's Mark Mullin. Traynor rallied to catch Rawson at the tape but missed Mullin. The winning time of 4:06.4 broke the meet record by more than a second as did Traynor's runnerup time of 4:06.9 and Rawson's 4:07.1 in third. Traynor found things much easier in the steeplechase 80 minutes later, running away from the field in 9:19.1, a meet record.

Also rising to the occasion for Villanova were shot putter Billy Joe, who went over 60 feet for the first time with a 60'6" effort, still far behind Gary Gubner's winning effort of 62'1¼". Pole vaulter Rolando Cruz set a personal pole vault best of 15'6" on his first try but then watched Maryland's John Belitza make the same height on his last try. Belitza then had a close miss at 15'11".

Morgan State sophomore Hubert Brown had a hand in two records. He first won the 440 in 46.7 to create one meet record and then helped his Morgan State teammates set another in the mile relay. Brown's third leg of 46.4 broke open the race as Morgan clocked 3:10.6, also a meet record.

Denver, Colo., May 26 -- Brigham Young overwhelmed the rest of the teams in the Skyline Conference championships but New Mexico's Adolph Plummer was the individual standout of the meet. BYU won the final conference title (the league was disbanded following the meet) with 70½ points as New Mexico took second with 45. Plummer won the 440 in 46.2 and the 220 in 21.7 but saved his best race for last, the mile relay. New Mexico was about 30 yards behind when Plummer took the baton for the final leg. He kept gaining on his opponents but narrowly missed at the finish. New Mexico coach Hugh Hackett caught his ace in 44.4 while another Lobo aide also had a 44.4. Two less prejudiced timers caught Plummer in 44.9 and 45.0, still plenty fast. BYU won the mile relay with Utah and New Mexico tying for second. ## Jay Silvester Throws 199'

Compton, Calif., June 2 -- The outstanding athlete award at the Compton Invitational went to Bruce Kidd and his 13:43.8 for 5,000

meters is reported in the June issue of Track & Field News. Another top candidate for the award was Jay Silvester, whose 199' in the discus was the third best of all time.

The other discus throwers were sharp, too, as Stanford's Dave Weill set a national collegiate record of 191'7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and veterans Rink Babka and Bob Humphreys were also over 190' with 191'2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and 190'6" efforts. Another weightman who was sharp was Dallas Long, who had two throws better than Gary Gubner's 63'9 $\frac{3}{4}$ " in second place. Long hit his best of the night, 64'11 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", on the second throw and he had a 64'8 $\frac{3}{4}$ " on the fifth round. Long's teammate, Rex Cawley, showed that he has returned to top form with a fine triple. In the 440 he ran 46.3 as Ullis Williams improved to 45.9. Cawley then won the 400 hurdles in 50.8 and closed out his night with a 46.4 third leg to help Southern California clock a runnerup 3:07.5 in the mile relay. Arizona State was again the winner, setting a collegiate record of 3:05.7 and missing the world record by only a tenth.

## Halberg Runs 13:55.8 5000

Houston, Texas, June 8 -- New Zealand's Murray Halberg gave Southern fans their first look at a world class distance performance when he ran away from the pack to win a special 5000 meters race in 13:55.8 at the Meet of Champions.

Halberg clocked 13:30.6 for three miles enroute and finished nearly half a lap in front of his nearest competitor, ex-Polish army officer John Macy. Running the first mile in 4:25, the Olympic champion dropped to 9:01 but again picked up the pace for the remaining distance. Davies' countryman, John Davies, pushed Cary Weisiger to a meet record 4:01.8 in the mile. A slow third quarter of 64 seconds ruined the chances of a sub-four minute mile. Davies ran 4:02.3 in second and Australian Pat Clohesy dropped down from the distances to clock 4:04.1 in third.

Glenn Winningham of the U.S. Army saved his best effort for last in the javelin and edged early leader Jerry Dyes, 255'10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to 250'5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Dyes made up for this defeat by taking the triple jump with a 49'10 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Two members of the 1960 U.S. Olympic team found the going tough. Anthony Watson broad jumped 25'1" but placed only third as McMurry's Bill Miller won at 25'9" and Bob Shirey leaped 25'1 $\frac{3}{4}$ ". Earl Young finished third in the 440 and was last in the 220 around a turn. Ray Saddler, the Texas Southern freshman, won easily in 46.4 as former Houston star Ollan Cassell nipped Young, 46.9 to 47.0, for second. Nebraska's Ray Knaub won the 220 in 21.0 but finished second to Homer Jones' 9.4 in the 100.

The closest event of the night was the 3,000-meter steeplechase where NCAA champion John Lawler and Geoff Walker, both Australians, ran identical 9:03.6's. Lawler, coming fast after an early season knee injury, was two yards down at the last hurdle and almost caught Walker as they went across the finish together.

Stanford, Calif., June 9 -- Jerry Siebert came within two-tenths of a second of the American 880 record with a 1:47.0 performance at the Pacific AAU meet. Siebert's time, the third fastest of all time, was achieved after Stanford's Rich Klier set the pace with a 52.6 for the first 440. ## Oregon Wins NCAA Title

Eugene, Oregon, June 16 -- The University of Oregon, capitalizing on outstanding performances by hurdlers Jerry Tarr and Mel Renfro, miler Dyrol Burleson and sprinter Harry Jerome easily won the NCAA team title before the home folks with 85 points, more than double the 40 3/7 scored by runnerup Villanova.

Tarr was the outstanding athlete of the meet, first taking the high hurdles in a wind-aided 13.5 as Renfro took second in 13.8 and then coming back to trounce the field in the 440 hurdles with a 50.3 clocking. Burleson set a meet record in the mile, clocking 3:59.8 for his third straight victory in the event. Jerome lost to Frank Budd in the 100 but won the 220 around a turn in 20.8 after posting two 20.7's in heats. Renfro, in addition to his high hurdling, also took third in the broad jump at 25'11¼". Tarr, Renfro and Jerome scored 52 points for Oregon.

Of the 10 defending champions half of them repeated, Burleson, Budd in the 100, Pat Clohessy of Houston in the three mile, Tarr in the high hurdles and Dallas Long of Southern California in the shot put. Defending champions who fell by the wayside were Budd in the 220, New Mexico's Adolph Plummer in the 440, Abilene Christian's John Lawler in the steeplechase, Boston University's John Thomas in the high jump and Colorado's Don Meyers in the broad jump. However, Meyers claimed part of another title when he tied for first in the pole vault. As usual there were many surprises but two of the biggest were Kermit Alexander of UCLA in the triple jump and Roger Olsen of California in the high jump. Olsen, a sophomore, set a personal best of 6'10" to score his first ever victory in collegiate competition.
