Brown, Robinson Score Doubles in NCAA

Berkeley, Calif., June 17-18-19--Doug Brown and Clarence Robinson posted rare double victories in their specialties, and Tom Farrell and Bob Day won spirited competitions in the 880 and mile during the 44th NCAA championships.

Whatever the meet lacked in sensational marks was clearly substituted for in exciting individual and team title competition. Perhaps there has never been a team title chase waged so fiercely. Beginning the third day of competition, seven teams still had a chance to cop the title while T&FN's favorite, Stanford, had already fallen by the wayside. Three teams still had an opportunity to win going into the final event, the mile relay. Southern California had 32 points, and wasn't entered in the baton event. Oregon had 28 and Brigham Young 27, and both were entered and had a chance to better USC's total. But Oregon could place no higher than fourth for four points, while BYU ran out of the money. As a result, Southern Cal and Oregon finished in a tie. California garnered fourth with 25½, half a point more than New Mexico and Nebraska, which never was in the team title running. Washington State was seventh with 23½, San Jose State in a tie for eighth with 18, and Stanford 21st with 13. Injuries to sprinters Tommie Smith and Larry Questad were instrumental in the poor showing by San Jose and Stanford.

Every individual event winner was a sophomore or junior, except Farrell who still has another semester of eligibility. This year, however, of the six returning champions only Farrell emerged victorious.

Brown, a junior from Montana, scored the first three-mile/six-mile national collegiate championship double--and both in meet record times. After leading Washington State's French nationalist, Chris Westman, by a foot for virtually the entire first four miles of the longer race, Brown moved out on the 17th lap. After miles of 4:38, 4:43, 4:45, and 4:41.5, he increased his tempo during the fifth to 4:40.5 which put him yards ahead of Westman--and then with a series of records in sight and an enthusiastic crowd roaring encouragement covered the last mile in 4:31.2 for a brilliant 27:59.2 clocking. His time reduced the meet record of 29:37.8, actually set for 10,000-meters but still the fastest ever for six-miles in this meet, and the national collegiate pending mark set by Gerry Lindgren the week before at 28:21.8. Only Ron Larrieu (American record of 27:54.0) and Billy Mills (27:56.2) have run faster as US citizens. And he moved into the top 25 world performers list. Westman finished in a creditable 28:34.0 for second, ahead of St. John's Larry Furnell (28:58.2).

Two days later, Brown was ready for three-miles. This race was close among three competitors the entire distance. Brown and Westman exchanged the lead several times during the first 11 laps, but Kansas' John Lawson was always a close second or third. As they went into the final lap, Westman was leading but Brown quickly swept by only to find Lawson jumping him at the top of the curve. Going down the backstretch, Lawson built up a slight lead and it looked as though Brown could not match Lawson's kick. But gradually, particularly on the final curve, Brown began moving up and about 150 yards from the tape drew close. Never more than six inches separated the two down the homefront, and it was something less than that that divided them at the tape. The photometer revealed that Brown was an ever-so slight victor in 13:40.2. Last year, the 5000 had resulted in a deadheat between Army's Bill Straub and the Air Force's Jim Murphy. Brown's time here improved upon the 13:47.7 mark set by Pat Clohessy in 1961.

The third distance event was won by Bruce Mortenson of Oregon, who won the steeplechase in a mediocre 9:00.8. Oregon State sophomore Tracy Smith scored in all three distance events--a fourth in the six-miles in his first ever try at the event as well as two sixths in the steeplechase and three-miles.

Robinson, a junior from New Mexico, jumped off with the first long jump-triple jump double victories since 1932 with marks of 25'10½" and 50'2". Even so, he passed two of his jumps in each event as his heels are still bruised. Surprise failures included two non-finalists: long jumper Phil Shinnick of Washington and triple jumper Les Bond of San Jose State.

The heats of the 880 and mile were murderous. Surprisingly, seven members of the three sub-7:20 two-mile relay teams were eliminated in the quarter-finals or semi-finals of the half-mile. Southern California lost Bruce Bess (1:55.0) and Dennis Carr (1:50.8) in heats and Dave Buck (1:50.1) in a semi; Tom Oakley was not entered. Villanova's Jim Orr (1:51.1) and Al Adams (1:59.9) both failed in heats. Oklahoma State's two misses were hard luck victims, failing to qualify for the finals with 1:48.5 (Jim Mercalfe) and 1:49.4 (Dave Perry). Villanova's Tom Sullivan and Oklahoma State's Tom Von Ruden made the finals of the mile but failed to place in ninth (4:11.5) and tenth places (4:13.2). Successful were Villanova's Noel Carroll and OSU's John Perry who wound up second and sixth in the 880 in 1:48.9 and 1:50.2.

Ohio's Darnell Mitchell led most of the two-lapper, until Carroll darted into the lead at the 660 post. Farrell, running in an unaccustomed close-to-front position most of the race, took off on the final curve and charged past Carroll as they entered the home stretch. Farrell powered home in 1:48.1, an eight-tenths of a second winner. Oregon's Wade Bell elected to run from arrears and was never a serious contender as he finished fifth in 1:49.8.

The mile was incredible. Never has there been such a punishing early pace. Day, a junior from UCLA, passed the 1320 post in an almost incomprehensible 2:54.7 and although he tired badly in the last quarter he showed little indication of tying up or losing control. Hot from a solo 3:56.4 effort the week before, Day gave the astonished spectators the feeling that someday he will continue his hot pace in the last 440--instead of running a 67.1 last lap as he did here for a narrow 4:01.8 victory.

But it was victory that was Day's all-consuming goal. A great front-running pacer, Day knew that he had to destroy the finishing kick of his most serious opposition, Morgan Groth, who has run bests of 1:46.4 and 3:57.9. Groth's coach Sam Bell had said he hoped that Day would pass the 1320 post in 2:56 because Groth would be with him and would outkick him in the final quarter. Day must have believed that Groth could because he set out at an even faster pace.

At the crack of the gun, Groth actually raced into the lead but Day, appearing to be sprinting, dashed by Groth just before the 220 and was timed in 27.3. Missouri's Robin Lingle, an outside threat, was in hot pursuit. The pace hardly slackened as Day led the two past the quarter post in a phenomenal 55.3. At the curve of the second lap, Day began drawing away. It seemed as though he was increasing his pace but in fact Groth and Lingle were dropping off the hot pace. Day passed the 660 in 1:23.7 after a 28.4 220. He continued to press, and passed through the fourth 220 in 29.7 for a 1:53.4 880 time. By now, everyone was well back of Day. By the time he passed the 1100 mark, in 2:23.4, he was so far in front that he could have eased off the pace. But he didn't, and there were immediate conjectures of a world's record--or that he would fail to win. He ran his sixth 220 in 30.3 for a 2:54.7 three-quarters time. And then fatigue began to set in. His next 220 was 32.5, and the field was charging fast on a remarkable physical specimen that had simply built up a tremendous oxygen debt. He looked back numerous times at the approaching figures on the homestretch but there was no way to make his body go faster. He hung on for a six-tenths victory. Bob Delany of BYU was a surprising second in 4:02.4, with Lingle third in 4:02.5, Ed Dean of Notre Dame fourth in 4:03.6, and finally Groth, who slipped to fifth in 4:04.7--obviously beaten by Day's tactics.

Kentucky State's Jim Kemp won his heat and semi-final races in 47.0 and 46.2--and both times he blasted out of the blocks, built up a sizeable lead, and then tied up slightly down the final stretch. In the finals, he started out much slower, gradually sped up, and then coming off the final curve turned on his great speed and power to come home a victor in 46.2. California's Forrest Beaty and Dave Archibald placed two-three in 46.3 and 46.4 as Ted Nelson, Lynn Saunders, Barry Sugden, and Doug Thompson failed to place.

North Carolina College's Edwin Robert: was rated at least a co-favorite for both sprint titles. He failed to win either, as he false started twice in the 100 and was nipped at the wire by Villanova's

Earl Horner in the 220. Colorado's intermediate hurdler-turned-furlong-runner Jim Miller wound up third in 21.2 after Smith and Questad failed to qualify because of injuries.

The high hurdles did not particularly go in form. Southern California's Paul Kerry upset Utah State's Gerry Cerulla (both sophomores) in 13.9, and Southern Cal's Terry Viltz took Tennessee's Pat Pomphrey for third in 14.0. BYU's Al Rockwell failed to make the finals. The intermediates found Villanova's Larry Livers and LSU's Leland Albright both placing last in their heats. San Diego State's Larry Godfrey caught Oxy's Vance Peterson at the tape to win by a tenth in 51.5.

Connolly, Burke Raise US Hammer Stock

Walnut, Calif., June 20--Hal Connolly wanted to fade away af-ter the 1964 Olympics because of his sixth place finish but at the Cali-fornia Relays this year he upped his 1962 world's record from 231'10" to 233'2" and here at the SPAAAU Championships again raised the re-cord to 233'9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

His series, while not as impressive as at Modesto this spring, was still outstanding. His record toss came on his first throw, prob-ably because Ed Burke had a warm-up toss of 229-foot plus. His other throws were 225'3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", 228'1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", 225'3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", F, 225'3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

From a provincial viewpoint, Burke's performance was almost equally sensational, for he raised his lifetime best 221'2" (at Mt SAC this year) to 228'8". That throw puts him fifth on the all-time world performers list, behind Connolly, Gyula Zsivotzky (231'1 $\frac{1}{2}$ "), Heinrich Thun (228'11"), and Romuald Klim (228'9 $\frac{1}{2}$ "), and ninth on the per-formances list. After his great warm-up heave, his first three throws measured approximately 216-plus, 220-plus, 222-plus. He had a practice toss before the finals began of 226-plus. And then his final throws were 224-plus, foul of 228-plus, and finally 228'8".
